MATCH REPORT ROUNDUP

LAST-GASP ASCOT EDGE OUT BINFIELD 3-2



Late own goal digs Yellamen out of Moles' hole

Friday 12th January 2024, Pitching In Isthmian League South Central, Binfield 2 - 3 Ascot United

Debutant Liam Tack scored two and had a huge hand in his side's winner as Ascot United left it late to beat neighbours Binfield in Friday night's league encounter under the lights. Tack opened the scoring and then levelled it after Binfield had turned the match on its head, before an own goal following his 89th minute strike sealed a comeback win.

Harris and Tack to put Ascot back on track?

The Yellamen announced the high-profile signings of Ben Harris and Tack prior to kick off. Harris, a striker who needed little introduction to the yellow-and-blue faithful, bagged seven goals in seven games during his first a stint with Ascot back in 2017-18; one which would ultimately galvanise a squad desperately struggling at the time after returning to the UK from top-flight football in New Zealand. Tack, meanwhile, arrived with an equally impressive CV having featured alongside Harris at Bracknell Town this season; both had also played in The Robins' narrow FA Cup defeat at EFL side Cambridge United just two months earlier.

Yellamen look to steal a march with rivals on the road

Ascot were looking to end a disappointing run of just one win in six and put points on the board ahead of a Saturday programme where many of their fellow lower-half teams were on the road; Met Police, Ashford, Guernsey and Corinthian Casuals all with tricky away days less than 24 hours later.

Forest Road derby often tight and no different on the night

The first half transpired into a tight affair, although it initially looked otherwise when Ascot took the lead after just eleven minutes. Ben Harris and Tack were involved at either end of the move as the former laid the ball off for Sean McCormack, he whipped in a cross that Ollie Harris flicked on, and Tack bundled both the ball and himself into the back of the net from close range.

Tyler turns the tables as Binfield press Cruz control

But this was a different, more resolute Binfield side who battled hard – and duly equalised when Shimron Eaton sat two Ascot defenders down and whipped in a cross that Tyler D'Cruz glanced home at the far post just eight minutes after going behind. Home 'keeper Killian Barrett did well with a ball over the top from opposite number Hugo Sobte and Dan Bailey's important block thwarted Dontaye Whittaker at the other end, but it was otherwise quiet as the half ended all square. After both HARRISES had threatened for Ascot early in the second half, Binfield took the lead when Sobte failed to come for a deep cross before D'Cruz nonchalantly rolled the ball into the net at the near post; the travelling faithful somewhat shell-shocked at this point.

Yellamen find a way – with a helping foot

Ollie Harris then led the charge with a wonderful dipping volley on the turn that brought a stunning save out of Barrett before manager Jamie Tompkins rang the changes; Ben Harris creditably giving 66 minutes off a season of bit-parts. Ollie Harris then threatened again from a tight angle albeit his heavy touch from Harry Laffin's back-heel had made the chance more improbable as Barrett saved, but the second of two chances for Dan Bailey yielded a 72nd minute corner that landed for Tack, who swivelled and squirmed a rising left-footed effort into the roof of the net to level it up. At the other end, Sobte earned his corn with a fine save to tip Ben Stallard's thunderous free-kick onto the woodwork and over with five minutes to go, but it was Ascot who won it late-on when McCormack dinked the ball over for Tack, Tack's shot was saved by Barrett, and defender Jack Matton couldn't react quick enough to adjust his feet as he diverted the rebound into his own net. The Yellamen saw out six minutes of injury time with McCormack's important block averting one last sniff of Binfield danger three minutes in, but The Yellamen held on to the delight of their 70-or-so travelling supporters.

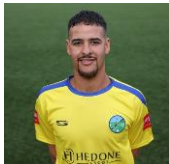

Sean McCormack – forward. Skilful forward signed from Walton and Hershaw in 21/22 and previously with Maidenhead United and Bracknell Town. Was the players' and supporters' POY in his first campaign after dazzling on the right wing. Incredible workrate and vision and tracks back to cover the defence. Another FA vase winner.

Usman Lalustani – forward. Rejoined The Yellamen in 22/23 after featuring in 18/19 and 19/20 when he netted 11 goals from 38 appearances. Maintains high fitness levels and on his day will cause problems for any defence. An ice-cool character, he scored the winning penalty in the FA Vase Quarter Final in but was suspended for the final.



Ben Harris - forward. Experienced striker who won the New Zealand championship with Team Wellington sandwiched between spells at Hampton a Richmond Borough, Windsor, Slough Town and Bracknell Town. Rejoined Ascot in January 2024 after featuring in 17/18 following his return to the UK. Excellent in the air and a proven goalscorer who has consistently played at a higher level.

Jamie Tompkins – manager. Highly respected throughout the club who won the league cup in his first season (18/19) and almost won the league in 20/21 only for COVID to strike. However, overseeing a league and FA Vase double in 22/23 eclipsed all that went before and he now gets the chance to have a crack at Step 4 in 23/24. Jamie is also Senior Director of Football Development at Brentford FC.



Dean Greenwood – assistant manager. Joined the coaching team in November 2022 and also has first team management experience from his spells in charge at Ashford Town (Middx) and Camberley Town. Also helped mastermind the league and FA Vase double.

Steve Quelch – coach. Many years of experience in the local game with Chalvey Sports and is a UEFA B coach, joined the club ahead of the 2019/20 season. A big character, especially during our 22/23 double-winning campaign.



Stuart Britton – strength and conditioning coach. Joining in the summer of 2021, 'Stu' joined to focus on the fitness, recovery and injury prevention and rehabilitation of the squad which was invaluable during the gruelling 22/23 league and FA Vase campaign.

Nathan Riley – physio. Joined us in 22/23 and becomes the club's main physio for 23/24. Another important member of our double-winning team.

CLUB HISTORY - ASCOT UNITED

Ascot United as we know it, was founded in 1965 by a men's team who played their games at Sunninghill with "after match meetings" in The Wells in Cheapside village (now Mikado's). Teams played as long ago as 1928 under the name "Ascot United" but nothing to link them directly to the current club. In 1965, the club had gained permission from the Ascot Racecourse Trustees to convert the land east of coach park 10 into a football pitch. A wooden clubhouse was built, and this team went on to win many prestigious trophies in the years that followed.

Various youth teams represented Ascot United over the years up to 1988, and in 1992 the East Berks 7-a-side Association was formed by our then Chairman Keith Wicks, introducing small-sided junior games and having disbanded in 1980 the men's team also reformed. The men's senior team enjoyed early success through the East Berks League gaining continued promotions to the Senior division and winning various Cups including the Fielden Charity Cup in 1996/7. In 2001, the First Team join the Reading Senior League, were awarded FA Charter Standard status in 2004, and won the Reading Evening Post Senior Cup at the Madejski Stadium in 2006. Promotion to the Hellenic League Division 1 soon followed in 2007, before promotion to the Premier Division in 2009.

"The Yellamen" made their debut in the FA Cup in 2011 with a home tie against Wembley FC. The game attracted 1,149 people to The Racecourse on a Friday evening where the famous trophy itself was on display, and the match was streamed live on Facebook. In 2012-13 and 2015-16 we reached the Quarter Final of the FA Vase twice, enjoyed two top-three finishes in the UHlsport Hellenic League Premier Division, and won both the Bluefin Sport Challenge Cup and Perpetua Press Floodlit Cup. In 2018-19, new manager Jamie Tompkins led his side to the top of the table for long spells, and although they couldn't hang on to their lead, they would taste league cup glory once again by defeating Windsor FC 3-1.

A lateral move to the Combined Counties Premier Division for the 2019-20 season, combined with the installation of a new 3G pitch provided a platform for further development both on and off the pitch. The Yellamen were clear at the top of the league before COVID curtailed their first crack at the title before the 2021-22 season saw them reach the Bucks Senior Cup Final after defeating three sides from higher divisions, including Wycombe Wanderers in the semi-final in front of a club-record crowd of 1,267.

However, it is the 2022-23 campaign that will surely remain the club's most successful for decades to come. Tompkins' side dominated the league, taking 102 points from 38 league matches to win the title with four matches to spare. And if that wasn't enough, they achieved an incredible double by lifting the Isuzu FA Vase at Wembley in front of over 4,400 travelling Ascot United supporters and the BT Sport cameras. Impressively, they entered in the very first qualifying round before winning ten matches in a mesmerizing run; Kai Walters heading home in the 79th minute to secure a 1-0 win over the then-holders Newport Pagnell Town.

The club has also enjoyed much success at all levels particularly in the Women's and Girls Section. Our Senior Women won promotion to the Premier Division of the Southern Region Women's Football League in 2017-18 and enjoyed their best season in 2022-23 when they were runners-up but ended on a high by winning the league cup. Our Women's Phoenix side achieved back-to-back promotions from the Thames Valley League to take their place just one level below the Senior side for 2023-24, and the newly-formed Junior Premier League (U18s) also won their league title at the first attempt in 2022-23.

Ascot United has grown to become one of the largest Community football clubs in the UK with over 1,000 registered players and over 90 teams playing every weekend embracing all ages and abilities from 5 year olds through to veterans. We are also extremely proud to have a mixed-ability team representing our club, the Ascot United Warriors, who are affiliated with Special Olympics GB. The future is bright.



CLUB HISTORY - HARTLEY WINTNEY

The club was established in 1897. They played in the Basingstoke & District League before transferring to the Aldershot & District League, where the club won three consecutive league titles in the mid-1970s. In 1978 Hartley Wintney were founder members of the Home Counties League, which was renamed the Combined Counties League in 1979. They were runners-up in 1980–81, and were placed in the Western Division when the league was separated into two sections in 1981–82. When the league reverted to a single division in 1982–83, the club were league champions. Although they won the league's Challenge Trophy in 1987–88 and again in 1989–90, the team went into decline and finished second-from-bottom of the league twice in successive seasons in 1998–99 and 1999–2000.

When the league gained a second division in 2003, Hartley Wintney were placed in the Premier Division. However, they were relegated to Division One at the end of the 2004–05 season after finishing second-from-bottom of the Premier Division. In 2007–08 a third-place finish saw them promoted back to the Premier Division, but they were relegated again at the end of the following season. Another third-place finish in 2011–12 led to the club being promoted back to the Premier Division again. In 2015–16 Hartley Wintney won the Premier Division, but were unable to take promotion to the next level as they were unable to make the necessary improvements to their ground before the deadline. However, they were champions again the following season, and were able to take promotion to the East Division of the Southern League.

In 2017–18 Hartley Wintney finished fourth in the East Division, qualifying for the promotion play-offs. After beating AFC Dunstable 2–0 in the semi-finals, they defeated Cambridge City 1–0 in the final to earn promotion to the Premier South division. The club finished bottom of the Premier Division South in 2022–23 and were relegated to the South Central Division of the Isthmian League.
