



ASCOT TAME LIONS TO REACH LEAGUE CUP SEMI FINAL

Comfortable 4-1 victory leaves Ascot in hunt for triple crown



Tuesday 21st March 2023, League Cup Quarter Final, Ascot United 4 - 1 London Lions

Ascot United eased to a 4-1 League Cup Quarter Final victory over London Lions on Tuesday evening, keeping them in the hunt for three separate trophies. Sitting at the top of the league and ninety minutes from an Isuzu FA Vase final, The Yellamen will now need to factor a league cup last-four tie into their busy run-in after beating their North London league rivals for the third time this season.

This was The Yellamen's first outing since their historic FA Vase victory against West Didsbury and Chorlton, and London Lions stood between them and reaching another semi-final, albeit this time in front of a crowd not even one tenth of the size of the capacity 1300 watching in Manchester ten days earlier. Ascot had already recorded a league double over the Lions, and manager Jamie Tompkins kept faith with many of his squad players for their third meeting as The Yellamen prepare for up to three games per week in a brutally congested run-in.

But the much-changed starting eleven – once again boasting youngster Luke Phillips and the returning Harry Laflin – were almost out of sight by half time in a devastating first-half display as good as witnessed in recent weeks. It was only four minutes when Ascot took the lead as Marcus Mealing and Keaton August fashioned the chance – the latter's well-placed low cross inviting Mealing to do what all good strikers do – get into the right position to slot home at the far post. Visiting 'keeper Nathan Bloom then saved well from August shortly afterwards, but it was 2-0 in the 14th minute when Mealing's exquisite through ball invited Usman Lalustani to race onto, and he opened his body before slotting low into the bottom right with his right foot.

Mealing then saw another shot saved before covering defender Jake Rinsler bravely threw himself in front of the rebound, and Ascot were thwarted by Bloom once again when Lalustani cut in from the left and fired a low effort that was beaten away. Mealing then skied a penalty over the bar in the 33rd minute – although justice was arguably done in the aftermath of a weak shove on August that was harshly penalized – although the visitors would lose defender Benji Weinberger to the sin bin for his remonstrations. The Lions survived those ten minutes of numerical inferiority, so it would come as a frustration to them that they conceded again on the stroke of half time when Lalustani had too much time, pace and skill to slot under Bloom from a central position for an unassailable 3-0 half-time lead.

The second half didn't match the first in terms of chances, but when the first arrived it was arguably the goal of the night when prolific visiting 'striker Austin Lipman did what he does best in leathering a direct free-kick into the top left before anyone could blink; Lipman himself earlier fouled to tee up the thunderbolt. For Ascot, youngster Luke Phillips impressed on the left-wing once again and the equally impressive Kai Walters might have done better from one of his deliveries midway through the half only to flash his header over the crossbar.

A flurry of changes left Ascot with fresh legs, although the last of them produced the fourth and final goal merely seconds after his introduction. And, it was none other than top scorer Brendan Matthew who skipped off the bench to be fouled in the box merely ten seconds after his introduction, and he picked himself up to plant home the resultant spot-kick less than sixty seconds later to make it 4-1. But that was enough, as the Yellamen comfortably wound down the clock aided by the energetic Sam Balogun, who was a stand-out performer on only his third appearance for the club. The Yellamen will now savour every minute of 48 hours' rest before visiting Holyport on Thursday evening.

ASCOT DIG DEEP TO REAT HOLYPORT

Supersubs are crucial as Yellamen win 3-1





Ascot United called on all their resources to beat Holyport 3-1 in yet another comeback win on Thursday evening. Trailing 1-0 and running out of luck, all five substitutes kickstarted what was looking like an unlikely turnaround as one of them – Marcus Mealing – continued his good form with a brace.

It seemed a long time since The Yellamen had been dumped out of the FA Cup by Holyport in what was one of just four defeats they have suffered this season, and the home side would no doubt take some inspiration from being one of just three teams who have got the better of Ascot alongside Flackwell Heath (twice) and Hilltop. But Ascot were still strong favourites against a side in a much better place than last season but certainly not safe from relegation, and they were able to rotate key players back into the starting line up having made changes for their league cup win just two days earlier. The game survived a 7pm pitch inspection, and on a difficult surface Ascot started well as Brendan Matthew's shot squirmed under home 'keeper Matteo Giacobbe and agonisingly wide in the 18th minute. At the other end, Rhys Forster raced off his line and bravely saved with his feet from Ramon Rose, and Forster would later save from the same player who escaped Rob Gerrard's attentions just after the half-hour mark, although in between those efforts Sean McCormack dragged wide for Ascot. But the home side took a 35th minute lead when Rose was left in acres of space to slot home, and although Harry Grant fired wide for Ascot and then the referee's assistant waved for offside after they had been awarded a penalty for hand-ball later on, it remained 1-0 to Holyport at the break.

Recently, the second half of Ascot's games have failed to live up to the first in terms of action, but on this occasion it was very much a different feast. The Yellamen swarmed around Holyport like wasps early-on as Giacobbe made a stunning save to divert Harry Grant's close-range thunderholt away before making another fine intervention to thwart Matthew when on both occasions it looked odds-on as if Ascot would equalise. Matthew was, however, fouled as he shot – no penalty given – and he would hobble off to be replaced by Mealing. And credit to the visitors who continued to try and play football on a deteriorating pitch; Dan Bailey's header was cleared off the line and Alfie Grant's effort went over the har from virtually underneath it as Ascot somehow failed to score, before manager Jamie Tompkins made three more crucial changes. One of them – the ever-energetic Kai Walters – was shoved in the box with 17 minutes of normal time remaining allowing Mealing the chance to atone for recent spot-kick woes, which he duly did by lacing the ball past Giacobbe; game very much on. At the other end, the good work was almost undone when Forster's thrown clearance was intercepted by Harry Hoath, but his left-footed shot sailed a few inches wide of the left-hand post; relief amongst the travelling faithful.

But after home defender Sam Jones was dismissed for a two-footed challenge on another exceptional Ascot substitute who had come on just after half-time – Sam Balogun – there would be only one winner. And, just five minutes later, Walters earnt his side a corner, Harry Grant swung it across, and Mealing got enough purchase on his far post header that bounced down and into the far right-hand corner for his and Ascot's second goal of the night. But after the earlier injury to Matthew, cautions, substitutions and earlier time-wasting there was still to be an incredible twelve minutes of added time, and although Holyport huffed and puffed they failed to seriously trouble Forster. And, they were ultimately undone on the break in the 101st minute when the simply outstanding Sean McCormack escaped down the right wing before cutting the ball back for substitute Duarte Surpanu – who took one touch and smashed the ball into the bottom right-hand corner from just off centre to seal the three points.

It was a case of as-you-were at the top after Reading City's win at London Lions, but games are ticking away and The Yellamen continue to show it is never over until it is over; this now being the fifteenth time in 43 games this season they have won after going behind. Games will now come thick and fast, and Wembley are the visitors to The Racecourse on Saturday as the charge on fixture congestion continues. But it's one game at a time as the squad's depth will seek to lengthen their season for their faithful travelling fans, who creditably matched their home counterparts at Summerleaze on an evening that both started and finished late. And, it was better late than never – and most importantly it was once again a case of never say die.







CLUB HISTORY - ASCOT UNITED

Ascot United as we know it, was founded in 1965 by a men's team who played their games at Sunninghill with "after match meetings" in The Wells in Cheapside village (now Mikado's). Teams played as long ago as 1928 under the name "Ascot United" but nothing to link them directly to the current club. In 1965, the club had gained permission from the Ascot Racecourse Trustees to convert the land east of coach park 10 into a football pitch. A wooden clubhouse was built, and this team went on to win many prestigious trophies in the years that followed.

Various youth teams represented Ascot United over the years up to 1988, and in 1992 the East Berks 7-a-side Association was formed by our then Chairman Keith Wicks, introducing small-sided junior games and having disbanded in 1980 the men's team also reformed. The men's senior team enjoyed early success through the East Berks League gaining continued promotions to the Senior division and winning various Cups including the Fielden Charity Cup in 1996/7. In 2001, the First Team join the Reading Senior League, were awarded FA Charter Standard status in 2004, and won the Reading Evening Post Senior Cup at the Madejski Stadium in 2006. Promotion to the Hellenic League Division 1 soon followed in 2007, before promotion to the Premier Division in 2009. The club today has grown to become one of the largest Community football clubs in the UK with over 1,000 registered players and over 70 teams playing every weekend embracing all ages and abilities from 5 year olds through to veterans. A new clubhouse opened in September 2010, together with an improved main pitch. floodlights and a stand.

"The Yellamen" made their debut in the FA Cup in 2011 with a home tie against Wembley FC. The game attracted 1,149 people to The Racecourse on a Friday evening where the famous trophy itself was on display, and the match was streamed live on Facebook. In 2012-13 and 2015-16 we reached the Quarter Final of the FA Vase twice, enjoyed two top-three finishes in the Uhlsport Hellenic League Premier Division, and won both the Bluefin Sport Challenge Cup and Perpetua Press Floodlit Cup. After finishing 2017-18 in style, in the following season new manager Jamie Tompkins led his side to the top of the table for long spells, winning two team-of-the-month awards, and finishing with league cup glory once again by defeating Windsor 3-1.

We were transferred into the Combined Counties League for the 2019-20 season, playing on our new 3G pitch facility, which transformed the club by facilitating more of our teams' matches and training at The Racecourse. The stronger platform facilitated further player development, and Jamie's young side would lead the table for long periods before establishing what looked like a title-winning margin at the top shortly before the league was aborted due to Coronavirus. Retaining much of the same squad for 2020-21, Jamie saw his side in and around the challengers before another pandemic-curtailed season, although they battled through to the league cup final where they were ultimately beaten on penalties by Redhill.

In 2021-22 Ascot finished 6th in the league, but the highlight was an eye-catching run to the final of the Berks and Bucks Senior Cup Final where they defeated three sides from higher divisions, including Wycombe Wanderers in the semi-final front of a club-record crowd of 1,267. For the current season, Ascot have strengthened their squad and made further ground developments; hopes are high that they will now push for the promotion they were cruelly denied in 2019-20.

The club has also enjoyed much success at all levels particularly in the Ladies and Girls Section where they are regularly winners of leagues and county Cups. Our senior Ladies won promotion to the Premier Division of the Southern Region Women's' Football League in 2017-18 and enjoyed their best season on 2021-22 with a top-four finish and a run to the First Round Proper of the FA Cup. Meanwhile, our Ladies Reserves won every league match of their Thames Valley League Division 3 campaign to secure promotion, also reaching the league cup final.



CLUB HISTORY - WEMBLEY

WEMBLEY FOOTBALL CLUB was formed in 1946 following an amalgamation of various junior clubs, predominantly Sudbury Ratepayers Association and Sudbury Rangers. Nicknamed the 'Lions', (the symbol of the British Empire Exhibition held at Wembley in 1924/25, the emblem was also used by the local speedway and ice-hockey teams), they found a home at Vale Farm and have remained there ever since, developing a roped-off pitch into a respectable non-League football ground. Entry was immediately made into the Middlesex League. After finishing a creditable fourth in their first season they went on to win the championship in 1941/48. A further season was spent in this league before the Club progressed into the Spartan League in 1949/50. Here they stayed for two years, clinching the Western Division title in 1950/51 as a result of which they became founder members of the Delbhan League.

In season 1955/56 they reached the finals of both the London Senior Cup and Middlesex Senior Cup and also finished runners-up in the Delphian League. In recognition of these achievements, they were invited to join the Corinthian League and subsequently vastly improved the facilities at Vale Farm. Following a quiet period, the Club moved into the Athenian League (1963/64) which had absorbed both the Corinthian and Delphian Leagues to create three divisions. Wembley were placed in the middle section. Malcolm Allison (1962-1963) and Allen Batsford (1964-1965) were both employed as coaches by the Lions during this period, although their respective spells were brief. Both gentlemen went on to have distinguished careers elsewhere and who knows where the Club might be today had either one of them remained at Vale Farm.

Wembley did manage to gain promotion to the Premier Division in 1967/68. To anticipate further progress floodlights were installed, a new clubhouse and dressing-room complex were built and eventually admission to the expanding Isthmian League was granted in 1975. Finished runners-up in their final season justified Wembley's elevation. Wembley began their first season in the Isthmian League (1975/76) in the second division (now the first division). The closest they came to promotion to the Premier Division was in 1985/86. After completing their fixtures, Wembley headed the table, but missed out on going up by two points when both St. Alban's City and Bromley won their respective games in hand. Only two teams went up in those days. Despite failing to achieve promotion, Wembley obtained some minor compensation by recording various cup successes during this period. In 1980/81 they reached the First Round Proper of the F.A. Cup for the one and only time, losing 0-3 to Enfield at Southbury Road.

The Middlesex Charity Cup was won outright for the first time in 1982/83, while the Middlesex Senior Cup was also clinched for the first time a season later with a dramatic 5-1 success over Hendon. In 1986/87 Wembley won the coveted Middlesex Cup double with final wins over Hayes in the Senior Cup and Feltham in the Charity Cup, a feat nearly repeated during the following season. Both finals were lost although the disappointment was tempered by beating Brentford at Griffin Park in the semi-final of the Middlesex Charity Cup, and having the final played at Wembley Stadium. Several unprofitable years have followed and a fire at Vale Farm during the summer of 1992 almost ended Wembley's existence. Fortunately, thanks to some splendid off-the-field work, new facilities were quickly erected, and the Club survived.

Wembley last won some silverware in 1994/95 with a 2-0 victory over Hampton in the final of the Middlesex Charity Cup. The Lions also went on to reach the second-round proper of the F.A. Trophy in 1995/96 (their best run in the old F.A. Amateur Cup was also ended at the second-round proper stage 1966/67 and 1968/69). However, their lengthy first division status was ended at the finish of that season when they suffered relegation into division two (now in Step Five).

By claiming third place, a quick return to the first division was achieved a season later, but their division one tenure lasted just two seasons and they relegated again at the end of 1998/99. As a result of the restructuring of the Isthmian League's constitution, Wembley regained a berth in the first division (north) for the 2002/03 season. But they were unable to maintain their place and were demoted into the second division at the end of that campaign. Wembley were forced to leave the Isthmian League set-up at the end of the 2005/06 season following the disbanding of the second division. They joined the Combined Counties League. A sterling effort was made to win promotion during their first season (2006/07)1, but they ran out of steam to end the term in third place.

Apart from that, they failed to make a real impact, although they did reach the final of the Combined Counties League Cup in 2010/11, but lost to Sandhurst Town, 0-1, at Farnborough. However, after their participation in the following season's F.A. Cup, (their Extra-Preliminary Round tie with Ascot United was covered live on Facebook) the competition sponsors, Budweiser, offered the Lions a much-publicised deal which they could not refuse. This included the signing of several retired professionals to help the Lions progress as far as possible in the 2012/13 F.A. Cup under the guidance of Terry Venables. Unfortunately, Wembley only played three games in the competition before bowing out.

After eight years, Wembley's membership of the Combined Counties League was ended by a lateral move across Step Five of the non-League pyramid into the Spartan South Midlands League Premier Division, joining in 2014/15. Here they stayed for seven seasons. Their highest placing was fourth in 2016/17, and the closest they came to winning a trophy was also in the same season, when they were runners-up in the Premier Division Cup, beaten nil-one by Hoddesdon Town in the final at Oxhey Jets.

Following two curtailed seasons in the S.S.M.L due to Covid 19, and further alterations to the non-League structure, Wembley were moved back into the Combined Counties League (2021/22) and are competing in their second season in the newly formed Premier Division North.
