A massive welcome to Leatherhead tonight as we play the first of 2 huge games under the lights. With Leatherhead comes a side steeped in history, including a fine FA Cup pedigree. The last 2-3 decades or so have been spent between the lsthmian League's step 3 and 4, including an appearance in the 2nd round proper of the FA Cup in 2017, but it was their 10-game run to the 4th round in 1974-75 which ended in a 3-2 defeat at Leicester City that often gets recalled alongside other favourite FA Cup moments such as Ronne Radford's goal for Hereford three seasons earlier than that. BRENDAN'S BRACE HELPS ASCOT THROUGH IN FA TROPHY

Yellamen hold on to win 3-2 against Horndean



Saturday 9th September 2023, Isuzu FA Trophy 1QR, Horndean 2 - 3 Ascot United

Ascot United survived a spirited fightback from Horndean in the Isuzu FA Trophy First Qualifying Round on Saturday. Brendan Matthew's double helped his side to a 3-0 lead with barely a quarter of an hour on the clock before the Hampshire side rallied, but they were unable to deny the Yellamen a debut win in the competition.

Blistering start in blistering heat

Whilst the cloud cover in the first half provided some shelter from the elements, it was a nonetheless warm affair to which Ascot quickly acclimatised.

Barely four minutes were on the clock when Matthew converted sharply from Sean McCormack's cross to give the visitors an early lead, and things got better in the eighth minute when Sammy Balogun drove forwards after Matthew had turned provider before firing a deflected effort past home 'keeper Cameron Scott.

And, Matthew was at it again just after the quarter-hour mark with a near copy of the first – slamming home first-time from McCormack's low right-wing cross once again after Jordan Ajanlekoko had earlier been involved.

Deans kickstart comeback

Ajanleloko himself tried his luck from distance before The Deans pulled a goal back in the 36th minute; Jack Willett getting the better of Ollie Lahtinen-Kalsi and firing past Hugo Sobte in off the inside of the left hand post after Harry Jackson had picked him out.

Ascot might have had a fourth when Matthew's shot was saved by Scott following Sobte's excellent long clearance, but it remained 3-1 as the sides changed ends.

Kicking down the slope in the second half the home side certainly had more of the ball and Sobte was alert to palm Jack Breed's long-range effort over in the 59th minute.

Josh Edwards had the ball in the net for Ascot soon after although he was penalized for handball, before Horndean set up a grandstand finish when Ronny Taw and Jackson combined on the right wing for Tommy Scott to slam home with twenty minutes remaining.

The Deans then threw everything at Ascot, although The Yellamen stood firm at the back and the closest they came to being breached was in the 86th minute when Lahtinen-Kalsi bravely threw himself in front of substitute Rudi Blankson's goal-bound close-range thunderbolt.

But The Yellamen held on to secure a home 2nd qualifying round tie with Lancing on Saturday September 23rd; The Sussex side beating Chipstead 4-2 to book their own berth.

What's next for Ascot?

The Yellamen will relish an exciting week ahead when Leatherhead (Tuesday) and Lewes (Friday) will provide tough league and FA Cup opposition at The Racecourse.



YOU can't beat a good feel-good story and Alex Fletcher's return to playing football certainly is one.

You may remember the 24-year-old was involved in a shocking incident last November while playing for the Romans against Dulwich Hamlet.

Fletcher collided with a perimeter wall during the game and had to be rushed to hospital where he spent five days in a coma.

Recovery has been long and arduous. He even had to learn how to walk again. But there were plenty of people in his corner with messages of support from across the game, including England manager Gareth Southgate and new Fulham signing Raul Jimenez, who himself suffered a serious head injury.

For us on the outside it's almost impossible to imagine what a tough period it has been for Fletcher.

We all read about the incident at the time, then heard of his recovery, but the hours away from the spotlight getting ready to come back with the support of his club must have gruelling. That's why it's so nice to see.

In last week's NLP, Fletcher told Bath City reporter — and NLP Step 2 results guru — Mark Stillman about his road back to the pitch, one he was determined to make.

And he did just that a fortnight ago, coming on as an 85th-minute substitute for good friend Cody Cooke. It was a poignant moment for Fletcher, his family and all at the National League South club.

"It was a bit emotional getting back out there," said Fletcher. "I can't really describe the words to say how it felt. It was goosebumps.

"I've played the situation so many times over in my head, just being here again. For it to finally happen felt surreal.

"The reception I got from everyone in the ground, including the Hampton players, meant so much to me.

"I've got over that hurdle. It's a massive milestone reached for me and now it's about building my minutes up but not rushing it, it's important for my body that I don't do that."

Jerry Gill's side have started the season well as they look for a return to Non-League's top flight.

Fletcher, who now wears a protective headband, added: "Hopefully I can start putting myself in contention for what's been a great start to the season though it might be tough as we've got such good attacking players, which can only be good for the team."





CLUB HISTORY - ASCOT UNITED

Ascot United as we know it, was founded in 1965 by a men's team who played their games at Sunninghill with "after match meetings" in The Wells in Cheapside village (now Mikado's). Teams played as long ago as 1928 under the name "Ascot United" but nothing to link them directly to the current club. In 1965, the club had gained permission from the Ascot Racecourse Trustees to convert the land east of coach park 10 into a football pitch. A wooden clubhouse was built, and this team went on to win many prestigious trophies in the years that followed.

Various youth teams represented Ascot United over the years up to 1988, and in 1992 the East Berks 7-a-side Association was formed by our then Chairman Keith Wicks, introducing small-sided junior games and having disbanded in 1980 the men's team also reformed. The men's senior team enjoyed early success through the East Berks League gaining continued promotions to the Senior division and winning various Cups including the Fielden Charity Cup in 1996/7. In 2001, the First Team join the Reading Senior League, were awarded FA Charter Standard status in 2004, and won the Reading Evening Post Senior Cup at the Madejski Stadium in 2006. Promotion to the Hellenic League Division 1 soon followed in 2007, before promotion to the Premier Division in 2009.

"The Yellamen" made their debut in the FA Cup in 2011 with a home tie against Wembley FC. The game attracted 1,149 people to The Racecourse on a Friday evening where the famous trophy itself was on display, and the match was streamed live on Facebook. In 2012-13 and 2015-16 we reached the Quarter Final of the FA Vase twice, enjoyed two topthree finishes in the Uhlsport Hellenic League Premier Division, and won both the Bluefin Sport Challenge Cup and Perpetua Press Floodlit Cup. In 2018-19, new manager Jamie Tompkins led his side to the top of the table for long spells, and although they couldn't hang on to their lead, they would taste league cup glory once again by defeating Windsor FC 3-1.

A lateral move to the Combined Counties Premier Division for the 2019-20 season, combined with the installation of a new 3G pitch provided a platform for further development both on and off the pitch. The Yellamen were clear at the top of the league before COVID curtailed their first crack at the title before the 2021-22 season saw them reach the Bucks Senior Cup Final after defeating three sides from higher divisions, including Wycombe Wanderers in the semi-final in front of a club-record crowd of 1,267.

However, it is the 2022-23 campaign that will surely remain the club's most successful for decades to come. Tompkins' side dominated the league, taking 102 points from 38 league matches to win the title with four matches to spare. And if that wasn't enough, they achieved an incredible double by lifting the Isuzu FA Vase at Wembley in front of over 4,400 travelling Ascot United supporters and the BT Sport cameras. Impressively, they entered in the very first qualifying round before winning ten matches in a mesmerizing run; Kai Walters heading home in the 79th minute to secure a 1-0 win over the then-holders Newport Pagnell Town.

The club has also enjoyed much success at all levels particularly in the Women's and Girls Section. Our Senior Women won promotion to the Premier Division of the Southern Region Women's' Football League in 2017-18 and enjoyed their best season in 2022-23 when they were runners-up but ended on a high by winning the league cup. Our Women's Phoenix side achieved back-to-back promotions from the Thames Valley League to take their place just one level below the Senior side for 2023-24, and the newly-formed Junior Premier League (U18s) also won their league title at the first attempt in 2022-23.

Ascot United has grown to become one of the largest Community football clubs in the UK with over 1,000 registered players and over 90 teams playing every weekend embracing all ages and abilities from 5 year olds through to veterans. We are also extremely proud to have a mixed-ability team representing our club, the Ascot United Warriors, who are affiliated with Special Olympics GB. The future is bright.



MEET THE OPPOSITION

HAYDEN BIRD - Experienced manager who was appointed to the Fetcham Grove hot seat in October 2022. Over the course of the last twenty years he has had successful spells as manager at Croydon Athletic, Carshalton Athletic, Merstham and Kingstonian. Achievements with the various clubs include a number of promotions, exciting runs in the FA Cup and FA Trophy and a number of County Cup successes.

TUTU HENRIQUES - Tutu has a wealth of experience as both a player and coach and has worked closely with Hayden at Bromley, Merstham and Kingstonian.

FIKAYO ATEWOLOGUN – Exciting young defender who came through the academy ranks at Dulwich Hamlet. Joined Tanners in December 2022.

KALANI BARTON – Young wing back who spent ten years at Selhurst Park before leaving the Premier League Club in the summer.

KENNY BEANEY – Experienced midfielder signed from Kingstonian last December. He has also played and enjoyed success at Merstham, Dulwich Hamlet, Wealdstone, Beckenham, Grays Athletic and Thurrock.

OLLIE COOK - Commanding centre-half signed from Carshalton Athletic in the summer. Started out with Fulham youth before joining the Southampton Academy. Counts Merstham and Kingstonian among his former clubs.

TYLER COX – Young skilful winger signed from Sutton Common Rovers in the summer. Has also turned out for Lingfield and Sutton Utd.

KACPER DANIELEWICZ – Young goalkeeper who has impressed between the sticks during pre-season. ALPHA DIALLO - Young midfield player who came through the youth ranks at Dulwich Hamlet and made his first team debut in 2022. Spent some time on Ioan at Merstham before signing for Tanners in 2022.

MICHAEL ELECHI - A Manchester United Youth graduate. Michael, joined their Academy in 2016, but was released in 2018. He subsequently joined Oxford United and signed his first professional contract in December 2018, lasting until summer 2022. Had been playing for Salisbury before signing in October 2022.

FRANCISCO GOMES – Young striker. Part of the Aspire Academy. Made his debut last season. Previous clubs include Lingfield.

DAN HECTOR – The speedy forward was an integral part of the Merstham and Kingstonian teams who enjoyed exceptional FA Cup campaigns. Dan is a former Leatherhead player, having appeared for a short spell under Nicky Bull. More recently, he has played for Carshalton Athletic and Sevenoaks Town.

OMARR LAWSON - Midfield player signed in December 2022. Previous clubs include Canvey Island, Bognor Regis, Dulwich Hamlet, Lewes, Crawley Down, Whitehawk, Sevenoaks, Ashford Utd & Kingstonian.

BRADLEY MANNING – Young full back who spent part of last season on loan from Aldershot. Signed permanently for the Tanners in the summer.

TREY MASIKINI - Attacking midfield player signed in the summer from Merstham. Has also played for Carshalton Athletic and Corinthian Casuals.TOBY McKIMM - Young goalkeeper who came through the ranks at Tonbridge Angels. Impressed when called upon last season.

BRIAN OKONKWO – Young Arsenal academy goalkeeper who has joined Tanners on a three month loan deal. Has previous senior experience at Hitchin Town.

LUKE PHAIR – Young midfield player who came through the youth and Academy ranks at Aldershot Town and Woking.

JERRY PUEMO – Centre back signed in December 2022 from Sittingbourne. Previous clubs include Cheshunt, Kingstonian, Bognor Regis Town and Farnborough.

TREVAN ROBINSON – Young striker signed from Chertsey Town in the summer. Previous clubs include Hanwell Town (where he came through the youth team) and Farnborough.

SERINE SANNEH - The former West Ham United and Crystal Palace goalkeeper played for Hayden at Kingstonian in 2021-22. He joined the Tanners in February 2023.

FABIO SARAIVA – Summer signing from Chatham, whom he helped to win promotion to Isthmian Premier last season. Has also played for Merstham, Kingstonian, Maidstone Utd and Woking.

JUNIOR SAVANE – Young French born defender signed from Dulwich Hamlet in the summer. Previously in the Boreham Wood academy and had Ioana spell at Great Wakering Rovers & Wingate & Finchley. Signed from East Grinstead in August 2023.

GUS SOW – The midfielder signed from Carshalton Athletic in June 2023. Gus scored fourteen goals for Kingstonian during the 2021-22 season. He spent three seasons with the K's after moving from Merstham. He previously played for Lewes, Dulwich Hamlet and St Albans City, after coming through the junior ranks at Crystal Palace.

JAMIE SPLATT – Signed from Dulwich Hamlet in 2023. A graduate of the Hamlet youth set-up, he made his first team debut in 2018. Has had loan spells at Merstham and Whitehawk.

DAVE TARPEY - Experienced striker who began his career at Henley Town before joining Basingstoke Town, Hampton & Richmond Borough, Walton & Hersham, Chertsey Town and Farnborough. Tarps joined Maidenhead United in 2014. His goals helped Maidenhead win the National League South title before he signed for Barnet in 2017. Injury curtailed his time with the Bees and he reunited with former manager Alan Dowson at Woking. In 2021 he joined Bracknell Town helping them to promotion from Isthmian Division One South Central before signing for Tanners in June 2022. In all Tarps has scored over 200 career goals.

CLUB HISTORY - LEATHERHEAD

LEATHERHEAD FOOTBALL CLUB can trace its history back to the formation of Leatherhead Rose in 1907. Rose were crowned Champions of the Dorking & District League in 1910 and 1919 before joining the Kingston and District League where they won the League title three times, the last in 1938-39. Leatherhead United were formed in 1924 and, in 1925-6, won Division One of the Sutton and District League. In the early 1930s. United joined the Surrey Junior League becoming Champions in 1933-4. After the War, officials of the two clubs met and in May 1946. Leatherhead Football Club was officially formed at a public meeting. United's Fetcham Grove ground was to be used as the home ground. The Tanners went on to win four consecutive Surrey Senior League Championships before spells in the Metropolitan. Delphian and Corinthian Leagues. Tanners were Corinthian League champions in 1963 before moving into the Athenian League. Leatherhead won promotion from Division One at the end of the first season and inaugurated their floodlights with a match against a Fulham side. Leatherhead won the Surrey Senior Cup for the first, and to date, only time in 1969. After being elected into the Isthmian League, Leatherhead made national headlines in 1974-5 when they reached the Fourth Round proper of the FA Cup, defeating League sides Colchester Utd and Brighton & Hove Albion before bowing out to First Division Leicester City 2-3. In subsequent seasons, the Tanners defeated two more Football League sides at the Grove – Cambridge United and Northampton Town. After the disappointment of defeat in FA Amateur Cup semi-finals in 1971 and 1974, the Tanners finally reached Wembley Stadium in 1978 but were beaten in the FA Trophy Final. The Club then entered a period of decline and were relegated in 1983 and in 1990, slipped down into Division Two South but were back in Division One in 1997. Finances were a problem and in the summer of 2000, the club was within a few days of folding but was saved by its supporters who took over following a crisis meeting. In 2006-7. Leatherhead were the lowest ranked team to reach the First Round Proper of the FA Cup. losing 1-2 at Football League side. Torquay United. Mick Sullivan was appointed First Team Manager in May 2009. Under Sullivan's guidance, the club had its most successful season in years, winning the Isthmian League Cup (the first major trophy for some 40 years) and finishing the season in fifth place in the League before losing a play-off semi-final (continued).



CLUB HISTORY - LEATHERHEAD

The following season, a dramatic play-off victory against Dulwich Hamlet (4-3 after extra time), saw The Tanners return to the Premier Division for the first time since 1983. Tanners stay lasted just the one season though. In 2013-14 Tanners reached the play offs again, this time edging out Guernsey 3-2, before winning a penalty shootout at Folkestone Invicta to return to the Ryman Premier Division. Sammy Moore was appointed in the summer of 2017. In his first managerial job Sammy steered Tanners to the second round of the FA Cup, a County Cup Final and a top eight finish in the League before departing for Concord Rangers along with the majority of the team. He was replaced by former Margate boss Nikki Bull who, despite having to rebuild the squad, took the team to an 8th place finish narrowly missing out on the play-offs.

After a poor start to the 2021-22 season Luke Tuffs was appointed manager in January 2022. but was unable to steer the club out of the relegation places, although from a seemingly impossible position it was very close.

After an indifferent start to 2022-23 Hayden Bird was appointed to the Fetcham Grove hot seat in October 2022.
