Welcome to the players, officials and supporters of Sutton Common Rovers for this Pitching In Isthmian League South Central Division match.



Welcome to The Racecourse for this league game against Sutton Common, whom from memory we have never met. Even in the first COVID-season where we were both in the Combined Counties League, we were still scheduled to meet them home and away as part of the seven-game run-in that never happened. SCR have previously played at Sutton United's Gander Green Lane, but are now at Whyteleafe. Formerly known as Mole Valley SCR, they got promotion to step 4 when the 2nd COVID wave hit and their average of PPG across the two curtailed seasons was enough for elevation. Impressively, in the six seasons between 2015-2021 that they entered the FA Vase under their new name, they reached the fifth round once, fourth round three times and third round once – a pretty decent cup record! Last weekend was a superb performance against Lancing – devastating show of attack – and after a midweek league cup defeat at Badshot Lea we'll be looking for more of that. ASCOT BEATEN IN LEAGUE CUP

Badshot Lea get revenge for earlier league defeat

Tuesday 26th September 2023, Velocity Trophy R2, Badshot Lea 1 - 0 Ascot United



Ascot United were edged out 1-0 by Badshot Lea in the Velocity Trophy second round on Tuesday evening. In a game where the tempo wasn't matched by the quality, Adam New's header midway through the second half sealed it for the hosts.

Ascot had already won this season's league encounter on The Baggies' turf one month earlier, and for instalment number two manager Jamie Tompkins duly shuffled his starting line-up bringing in Dan Bailey, Sammy Balogun and Jay Welch for Harry Tucker, Harry Grant and Jordan Ajanlekoko. The question would be how they would perform this time, especially so against a side who had won all four games since losing to Ascot on Bank Holiday Monday.

In an energetic first half, the home side created most of the chances, the first of which saw Hugo Sobte save with his feet from Anwar Ceesay after he had escaped the attentions or Ryan Case. Big defender Adam New glanced agonisingly wide from Max Herbert's free kick after Josh Edwards had been penalized for hand ball, but they came even closer in the 40th minute when New's close range header brought the best out of Sobte, who reacted quickly with a strong hand to palm the ball over the bar. The closest Ascot came was a minute later when Welch clattered the crossbar from Case's right-wing cross when it looked easier to score; 0-0 as the sides changed ends.

The home side looked like they would score, or at least force a shot, just after the hour mark only for Dan Bailey's brilliant last-ditch tackle to deny Mohammad Regragui as he shaped to shoot in a decent position. But they would soon get their goal, New rising unmarked to crash home a 66th minute header directly from a left-wing corner.

Harry Laflin, one of all five used visiting substitutes, made a positive impact from the bench and he forced Harry Cawdron into action with a deflected effort that the home' keeper smothered just two minutes after Ascot had gone behind. But Sobte was the busier of the two keepers as he saved Nick Medcraft's deflected effort and then denied Regragui again after Billy Oram had played him in.

The closest Ascot got was Brendan Matthew's glancing header just wide from Harry Grant's cross in the dying embers, but there was still time for Regragui to miss a sitter at the other end in added time when he fired over at the far post with a gaping net in front of him.

It didn't matter, the home side earnt their win, and Ascot will go again this weekend.

What's next for Ascot?

The Yellamen are back in league action this Saturday with the visit of Sutton Common Rovers – which will be only their fifth league game in thirteen matches - and as yesterday's FA Trophy draw pitted them with Isthmian Premier Division side Whitehawk, East Brighton is the destination for yet another cup tie one a week later. It'll be at least November before the Yellamen will have played more league matches than cup matches this season, but it's a nice challenge to navigate even if their Velocity Trophy campaign never gathered speed.



MENTION 'FA Cup fairytales' and your minds naturally think back to the magic produced on the field over the years; Wimbledon's historic win in '88, Luton Town beating Premier League Norwich on the road, or Lincoln City's mesmerising run to the quarter-finals in 2016-17.

But every year The NLP takes great delight in revealing the stories the fans don't see that the FA Cup never fails to conjure up.

This week, ahead of the third qualifying round we met three more unsung cup heroes who have their own particular reason to be glues to the action.

James Connor was cruelly denied a chance of fulfilling an FA Cup dream as a player.

Teenage midfielder had turned heads as a teenage midfielder at Aldershot FC when the then Division Four club were liquidated in the early 90s.

Labelled one of London's top young talents at the time, Mick McCarthy swooped to offer him an almost unheard-of five-year deal at Millwall, but just two months and 10 games into his fledgling career, a knee injury forced the young Lion to hang up his boots and set his sights on a different career at the ripe age of just 22.

These days, Connor now runs his own successful wealth management firm and, through choice, has had no dealings with football – until recently that is.

After agreeing to run his son's Under 9s at Hanworth Villa, Connor rediscovered his love for the game and is now very much back in the hotseat having taken over the chairmanship of the Isthmian League South Central club from his father Jim, who himself founded the Villains back in 1976.

This weekend, Connor turns their attentions to the FA Cup where victory at Horsham this afternoon will see them reach the fourth qualifying round for only the second time in the club's history.

"To be honest, I was never a huge football fan and never really understood the mentality of a football fan, until now," he told us. "I've been back in football now for two years and I'm loving every minute of it. The Non-League scene is such an exciting place to be. It's where it's at.

Those are the stories to the 'Road to Wembley' that supporters of the bigger clubs don't see.

"We've got a really tough game to come against Horsham and we'll be playing as the underdog. But giant-killings do happen in the FA Cup, it's what makes it such a special competition, so we're just really looking forward to it."

Someone far more used to the thrills and spills of a cup campaign is Paul Carden (continued).

He returns to the scene of his greatest triumph this afternoon when he takes his Nantwich Town side to face his old club Chester.

Dabbers boss Carden, 44, spent five years at the Deva during his days as an all-action midfielder, racking up more than 200 appearances across two separate spells. Relegated from the Football League shortly after joining the club in 2000, Carden briefly joined Doncaster but returned within months and in 2003-04 captained the Blues to the Conference title.

"I've got a lot of brilliant memories of Chester but that was the highlight," says Carden, whose Nantwich side who off Shifnal Town, Liversedge and Step 2 Banbury United on route to the Chester clash.

"But are we a banana skin for Chester? Do they get complacent thinking, 'It's a night game, we're at home to a side a couple of leagues below'. "Who knows? "We've just got to hope the stars align." The last remaining Step 5 side left in the draw are Emley AFC – and there's plenty of cup magic around the Welfare Ground too.

After Andrew Painten went to watch Emley for the first time with his dad as a boy, he often asked when they could go back.

Now, as chairman, he hopes his own son is savouring the moment – just like he did – with the West Yorkshire outfit on the up again.

"I've been a fan for long enough to recall we've often been the bridesmaid, never a bride," Painten said of the Northern Counties East League Premier Division side.

"I reckon we might just now be ready to get our glad rags on."

The Pewits' best FA Cup run for more than 20 years is inspired in part by wanting to make the most of a second chance after they were reinstated when Avro, their conquerors in the extra preliminary round, were removed from the competition as punishment fielding an ineligible player.

This week, they make the trip to National League North side Alfreton Town – a team ranked 70 places higher than them in the Pyramid – but boss Richard Tracey won't be daunted after eliminating two higher-ranked foes to reach this stage.

Painten said: "We've done it the hard way after being drawn away each time since coming back in. "It's a big ask to win the next one – just look at the league tables – but football has a funny way of defying what you think will happen." ~Jon Couch

Alex Sykes – goalkeeper. Goalkeeping coach and reliable backup. Has International experience having played for the England Futsal team. Part of the successful doublewinning squad of 22/23.

Josh Edwards – defence. Signed for the 23/24 season from Thatcham Town where he was player of the season in 22/23. A strong, powerful defender and excellent in 1 v 1 scenarios. Previously with Basinustoke Town.





Oliver Lahtinen-Kalsi – defence. Exciting addition for the 23/24 campaign having joined us on a season-long loan from National League neighbours Aldershot Town.

Technically strong and a consistently high performer who likes to get forward and has weighed in with important goals. Has made over 200 appearances heading into the 23/24 campaign. Another FA Vase winner.

Toby Thompson – defence. A product of the Ascot United junior ranks having also captained the Allied Under 18 side. Spent part of last season at Step 5 outfit Sheerwater, helping them escape relegation.





Harry Tucker – defence. Strong, commanding defender who oozes confidence on the hall and has excellent distribution. Previously with Kings Langley and Thame United. FA Vase winner.

Joe Gater – defence. Highly respected defender on the local scene having previously played Step 4 football with Bracknell Town and Binfield. Tall and physical with a strong aerial presence.





Rob Gerrard – defence. Powerful full back and technically strong. Big part of the FA Vase campaign, scoring a late equaliser in the semi-final and in the starting line-up Wembley before a head injury curtailed his afternoon. Signed from Thatcham Town in November 2022.

Jay Welch – midfield. Signed in 22/23, a versatile player who can play in defence or midfield. Bundles of energy and tenacity alongside great technical ability. Massive performance in winning the FA Vase and only denied a Wembley goal by the woodwork.





Harvey Killeen – midfield. A fantastic addition for 23/24 having signed from North Greenford United, for whom he starred against us in 22/23. Works incredibly hard, pops up all over the pitch and scores bags of goals despite not being an outright attacker.

Charlie Morgan – midfield. Exciting young talent who first featured in 22/23 and will continue to improve.

Ollie Harris – midfield. Signed from near neighbours Binfield in 22/23 where he was a huge part of The Moles' run to the FA Vase final in 20/21. A true clubman, he was a huge part of Ascot's double-winning campaign in 22/23 despite long-term injury and will bounce back in 23/24. Exceptionally quick and talented forward with baus of tricks.





Harry Grant – midfield. A Rolls Royce of a player and an excellent addition to the club in 22/23. Ex-professional at Gillingham, winning EFL League 2 and the FA Vase with Thatcham Town in 2017/18 before repeating the feat with Ascot United in 22/23.

Jordan Ajanlekoko – midfield. Cultured midfielder who signed in 22/23 after Step 3 experience with Beaconsfield. Previously featured for the Yellamen on Ioan with 2 appearances in 17/18 and became a permanent addition for the 22/23 season. Unavailable for the FA Vase final but a huge part of the cup run.





Sammy Balogun – midfield. Signed midway through the 22/23 season and proved invaluable in midfield with some big performances, especially in the 22/23 FA Vase Semi Final. Reads the game exceptionally well. Unused substitute at Wemblev.

Sean McCormack – forward. Skilful forward signed from Walton and Hersham in 21/22 and previously with Maidenhead United and Bracknell Town. Was the players' and supporters' POY in his first campaign after dazzling on the right wing. Incredible workrate and vision and tracks back to cover the defence. Another FA wase winner.





Harry Laflin – forward. Needs little introduction. 'Laffers' is a goal-machine who returned late in the 22/23 season to add more attacking options having scored 29 goals in 30 appearances for Ascot in 21/22. Has netted over 80 goals for the club heading into 23/24 in just over 150 games.

Brendan Matthew – forward. Exceptionally quick and a proven goalscorer. Signed for the 22/23 season from Egham Town and smashed Ascot' goalscoring record with 47 goals in his first season. Subsequently won just about every ward at the end-of-season presentation evening. On his day he is simply irrepressible. Another FA Vase winner.





Dan Brown – forward. Experienced striker who joins for 23/24 from Ashford Town having also featured for Wingate & Finchley.

Usman Lalustani – forward. Rejoined The Yellamen in 22/23 after featuring in 18/19 and 19/20 when he netted 11 goals from 38 appearances. Maintains high fitness levels and on his day will cause problems for any defence. An ice-cool character, he scored the winning penalty in the FA Vase Quarter Final in but was suspended for the final.

Jamie Tompkins – manager. Highly respected throughout the club who won the league cup in his first season (18/19) and almost won the league in 20/21 only for COVID to strike. However, overseeing a league and FA Vase double in 22/23 eclipsed all that went before and he now gets the chance to have a crack at Step 4 in 23/24. Jamie is also Senior Director of Football Develonment at Brentford FC.





Dean Greenwood – assistant manager. Joined the coaching team in November 2022 and also has first team management experience from his spells in charge at Ashford Town (Middx) and Camberley Town. Also helped mastermind the league and FA Vase double.

Steve Quelch – coach. Many years of experience in the local game with Chalvey Sports and is a UEFA B coach, joined the club ahead of the 2019/20 season. A big character, especially during our 22/23 double-winning campaign.





Stuart Britton – strength and conditioning coach. Joining in the summer of 2021, 'Stu' joined to focus on the fitness, recovery and injury prevention and rehabilitation of the squalling 22/23 league and FA Vase campaign.

Nathan Riley – physio. Joined us in 22/23 and becomes the club's main physio for 23/24. Another important member of our doublewinning team.

CLUB HISTORY - ASCOT UNITED

Ascot United as we know it, was founded in 1965 by a men's team who played their games at Sunninghill with "after match meetings" in The Wells in Cheapside village (now Mikado's). Teams played as long ago as 1928 under the name "Ascot United" but nothing to link them directly to the current club. In 1965, the club had gained permission from the Ascot Racecourse Trustees to convert the land east of coach park 10 into a football pitch. A wooden clubhouse was built, and this team went on to win many prestigious trophies in the years that followed.

Various youth teams represented Ascot United over the years up to 1988, and in 1992 the East Berks 7-a-side Association was formed by our then Chairman Keith Wicks, introducing small-sided junior games and having disbanded in 1980 the men's team also reformed. The men's senior team enjoyed early success through the East Berks League gaining continued promotions to the Senior division and winning various Cups including the Fielden Charity Cup in 1996/7. In 2001, the First Team join the Reading Senior League, were awarded FA Charter Standard status in 2004, and won the Reading Evening Post Senior Cup at the Madejski Stadium in 2006. Promotion to the Hellenic League Division 1 soon followed in 2007, before promotion to the Premier Division in 2009.

"The Yellamen" made their debut in the FA Cup in 2011 with a home tie against Wembley FC. The game attracted 1,149 people to The Racecourse on a Friday evening where the famous trophy itself was on display, and the match was streamed live on Facebook. In 2012-13 and 2015-16 we reached the Quarter Final of the FA Vase twice, enjoyed two top-three finishes in the Uhlsport Hellenic League Premier Division, and won both the Bluefin Sport Challenge Cup and Perpetua Press Floodlit Cup. In 2018-19, new manager Jamie Tompkins led his side to the top of the table for long spells, and although they couldn't hang on to their lead, they would taste league cup glory once again by defeating Windsor FC 3-1.

A lateral move to the Combined Counties Premier Division for the 2019-20 season, combined with the installation of a new 3G pitch provided a platform for further development both on and off the pitch. The Yellamen were clear at the top of the league before COVID curtailed their first crack at the title before the 2021-22 season saw them reach the Bucks Senior Cup Final after defeating three sides from higher divisions, including Wycombe Wanderers in the semi-final in front of a club-record crowd of 1.267.

However, it is the 2022-23 campaign that will surely remain the club's most successful for decades to come. Tompkins' side dominated the league, taking 102 points from 38 league matches to win the title with four matches to spare. And if that wasn't enough, they achieved an incredible double by lifting the Isuzu FA Vase at Wembley in front of over 4,400 travelling Ascot United supporters and the BT Sport cameras. Impressively, they entered in the very first qualifying round before winning ten matches in a mesmerizing run; Kai Walters heading home in the 79th minute to secure a 1-0 win over the then-holders Newport Pagnell Town.

The club has also enjoyed much success at all levels particularly in the Women's and Girls Section. Our Senior Women won promotion to the Premier Division of the Southern Region Women's' Football League in 2017-18 and enjoyed their best season in 2022-23 when they were runners-up but ended on a high by winning the league cup. Our Women's Phoenix side achieved back-to-back promotions from the Thames Valley League to take their place just one level below the Senior side for 2023-24, and the newly-formed Junior Premier League (U18s) also won their league title at the first attempt in 2022-23.

Ascot United has grown to become one of the largest Community football clubs in the UK with over 1,000 registered players and over 90 teams playing every weekend embracing all ages and abilities from 5 year olds through to veterans. We are also extremely proud to have a mixed-ability team representing our club, the Ascot United Warriors, who are affiliated with Special Olympics GB. The future is bright.



CLUB HISTORY - SUTTON COMMON ROVERS

Chairman and Life President Alan Salmon founded SCR F.C in 1978, when the club began life as INRAD FC, based in Carshalton. The club entered a new era when Alan moved to Sutton and arranged sponsorship with his new neighbour, CENTRE 21 FC was born. This era saw the club running one Saturday side, three Sunday sides and three Youth sides. Centre 21's sponsorship continued until the club's youth players were no longer under 21 years old.

The club again sought new a identity, SUTTON COMMON ROAD FC was formed and subsequently abbreviated to SCR FC. Since then the club has had five major sponsors whose names have been incorporated into the clubs affiliated name: SCR PLOUGH (twice), SCR GRAPES, next the club's longest sponsor SCR LITTEN TREE (7 years) & finally SCR Kingfisher, Ewell with whom we started our venture in Saturday football in 2004/05. It was at this point that the club took the decision to revert back to using the SCR name alone, feeling that as we strive for continued promotion we needed to disassociate ourselves with the whole 'pub team' image. The club however did take sponsorship form the Fox & Hounds, Carshalton for the Sat first team in 2006/07, but the decision was made that the pub name would not be incorporated into our own, for the above reason...

The club entered yet another new era this season, with the introduction of a third Saturday side (Messers Alex Avis & Tony Williams) and the 1's moving to the Middlesex County FL (and a name change SUTTON COMMON ROVERS) in the pursuit of combined Counties football, having made an unsuccessful application from the Surrey South Eastern Combination at the end of season 2006/07 having finished joint top (3rd on goal difference... -1 goal)

A third place finish in the Middlesex County League Premier division in 07/08 meant that our promotion to the CCL was not assured but months of hard work & determination from the management team SCR eventually secured a place for the clubs 1st time in their 30 year history at the league AGM in June 2008 and the reserves moved into the CCL reserve division under the guidance of Alex Avis & Justin Salmon. Season 08/09 saw the latest name change of the club, to form MOLE VALLEY SCR FC reflecting the area in which we played. Season 09/10 saw the club reach a Surrey Cup final, narrowly being defeated by Sutton United after a 1-1 extra time score line on penalties and in the same season compete in the FA Vase for the first time in our relatively short history. We finished Champions of Division One at the second time of asking, narrowly piping Worcester Park to the post in a fine run which saw us finish 3 points clear on the final match of the season, assuming as we believed, we were awarded the points from the postponed Coulsdon match who unfortunately were unable to field a side for our scheduled league game some weeks earlier.

The following season saw the club play at our highest level to date, and make our FA Cup debut, although this lasted just one game, and ended in a 5-0 defeat against Chertsey Town. The club managed two seasons in the Premier Division, before being relegated back to Division 1, following a start to the season that saw 12 straight league defeats. The 2012/13 season started with a rebuilt side and expectations of consolidation, however a 20 game unbeaten run propelled us into runners up spot, and a much coveted promotion back to the Premier Division.

CLUB HISTORY - SUTTON COMMON ROVERS

2013/14 started brightly, but went to the last game, and a point saw survival. It was the same the following season, and although we lost (2-0 at home to Guildford City), we still managed to survive. For the 2015/16 season, there was a change of name to Sutton Common Rovers, and after much hard work by the Salmons, a return to Sutton, and a ground share with Sutton Utd.

2016/17 saw a 12th place league finish and the capture of the Southern Combination Cup
The following season, 2017/18 we recorded our highest ever placing, finishing 3rd in the Premier Division,
and reached the semi final of both the Southern Combination Cup and the EL Records Premier Challenge
Cup.

2018/19 was our best ever season, finishing runners up in the Premier division behind the powerful Chertsey Town side, winning the Premier Challenge Cup and finishing runners up in the Southern Combination Challenge Cup

2019/20 saw the side a little off the pace in the league, when it was called to a halt, but with games in hand a place in the top 5 was possible. It was in the national cup competitions that new records were set, with the side reaching the 1st Qualifying Round of the FA Cup for the first time (after wins over Molesey 1-0, after a 1-1 draw; and Eastbourne Town 3-0), the FA Vase saw further success, with wins over Snodland Town 5-1, Raynes Park Vale 4-0, Lancing 1-0 (after a 3-3 draw); and Christchurch 2-1 taking us to the fifth round, where we bowed out to Western League AFC Bitton 2-1, after a disappointing performance down in Bristol. At the end of another curtailed season and following an FA restructure the club was moved up to Step 4 and the Isthmian South Central division.

Our first season in the Isthmian League saw a 17th place finish, on goal difference behind both Westfield and Tooting & Mitcham Utd, and avoidance of the relegation play offs. We also made our debut in the FA Trophy, albeit briefly, losing our only fixture away at Ramsgate.

We reached the 2nd qualifying round of the FA Cup for the first time, thanks to wins over Steyning Town and a shock win at Isthmian Premier Cray Wanderers, before losing after a replay to Jersey Bulls.

A run of 13 games without a point saw us slip perilously close to automatic relegation in our second season at Step 4, but a late season recovery, which actually had us 7th in current form over the last 10 games saw us secure a relegation play off spot, where Crawley Down Gatwick were defeated 2-0 to preserve our Isthmian place

Darren Salmon stepped down after nigh on 30 years at the helm at the end of the season, with assistant Sam Morgan stepping up to overall control of the side.
