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TAMWORTH's heroics aside, the most romantic story of FA Cup third round weekend was one which never actually materialised.

In 154 years of the competition, no father and son have ever played against each other, so when Premier League Everton pulled Peterborough United out of the hat, all talk was of the possibility of Everton full-back Ashley Young facing his 18-year-old son Tyler. Tyler was named on the Posh bench but, in the end, a tight game at Goodison Park meant that Peterborough boss Darren Ferguson had to put the needs of his team before the purists and the young midfielder didn't get on.

And in another twist to the tale, Ashley's brother, and Tyler's uncle, Lewis Young took charge of only his second game as caretaker manager, leading out Dagenham & Redbridge at Millwall on Monday night. Despite not quite etching their names in cup folklore, it proved a memorable weekend for the Young family – one to tell the grandchildren one day.

"It was fantastic to be there [at Everton] on Thursday night," Lewis told The NLP. It was a dream for me and the whole family all dotted around. "We probably ended up making it nearly a sell out because the amount of us went up." Ask any footballer of a certain age and they'll tell you it's every player's dream to see their son or daughter make their own way in the game – better still playing alongside them.

And that was the case for two former full-time stalwarts who lined up alongside their sons in Non-League last week. Ronnie Henry says he has fulfilled the final ambition of his 23-year playing career after playing alongside son Louie for Potters Bar. Stevenage legend Henry, 41, joined the Scholars in June after watching 17-year-old Louie play at the Lantern on loan from his former club last season. The centre-back even admitted that the possibility of left-back Louie returning to the Isthmian Premier division side had convinced him not to hang up his boots.

Henry was made to sweat, with talk of loan moves elsewhere, but the deal was completed last week and on Tuesday night the pair lined up in Max Mitchell's back four, helping the Scholars to a 2-1 win at Canvey Island.

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"I've achieved quite a few things in my career, but playing alongside Louie is right up there with any of them," Henry, who won two FA Trophies, a Conference title and the League Two play-offs during two glittering spells at the Lamex, told The NLP. "When I decided to play on for another year, it did depend on what Louie was going to do. And at times it looked like he would go elsewhere. So for him to come to Potters Bar and for me to play alongside him was a special, special moment.

"It's a moment that I didn't think was ever going to happen. I didn't even dream of it happening, to be honest. Even driving to the game, I thought 'This is surreal'. But when we crossed that white line, everything just felt really natural. "It was a fantastic experience and it almost feels like 'OK, I've achieved everything I could have hoped for in football now'."

Someone who knows exactly how Henry is feeling right now is Danny Kedwell. The Ashford United player/manager says it's an "amazing feeling" to partner his son in the Nuts & Bolts front line in the Isthmian South East division – even though he'd really rather not to! Kedwell has been forced to dust down his predatory scoring boots in recent weeks at the age of 41 to cover an injury and suspension crisis at the Homelands, which has propelled his 16-year-old schoolboy son Preston into the spotlight having netted three goals in his first six starts in senior football.

"He's only 16, he's still at school, so to get experience of men's football at his age is fantastic," said Kedwell Snr, who scored over 250 career goals for the likes of AFC Wimbledon, Gillingham and Ebbsfleet United. "In all my footballing career, I never thought I would ever be playing alongside my son.

"It's an amazing feeling, albeit unexpected because I don't really want to be playing at 41 to be honest! But with all the injuries and suspensions we've had, I had no choice. "I was buzzing for him, because it's hard for him being 16 years of age and the manager's son.

"It's an easy option not to play him but he doesn't deserve that. He's had six starts this season and got three goals. As a manager, if I think you are good enough to play then you'll play, and I'll treat you the same as anyone else. "When it comes to matchday, he's just a normal player. He's deserved his start like anyone else. He's been patient and every time he's come on he's done really well." "He's a natural goalscorer. He knows where the goal is and has a habit of being in the right place at the right time, You just can't buy that." ~Jon Couch

ASCOT LOSE OUT IN COUNTY CUP

Hungerford triumph 3-2 in see-saw encounter

Ascot United twice led before being edged out by Hungerford Town in the last sixteen of the Berks and Bucks Senior Cup on Tuesday evening. In an entertaining affair, all of the goals came within sixteen second-half minutes, as Ascot's thirteen-game unbeaten run came to an end.

County Cup Magic to wander back to Racecourse?

It was just under three years since Ascot United saw off a star-studded Wycombe Wanderers side at the semi-final stage in 2022 – a club record attendance 1,267 turned up that night – and with MK Dons lying in wait for the winners of this tie, the prospect of another EFL test was a worthy carrot for both sides. Standing in their way was Hungerford Town – a National League (South) side until two seasons ago – and even now at the step-three Southern League Premier (South) they arrived with plenty of pedigree, despite sitting just above the drop zone with just six league wins all season. Connor Holland's return from the head injury sustained between Christmas and New Year was a welcome sight, and he came back into the starting line-up alongside Khalid Simmo; Josh Edwards and Ben Harris making way for them from the team that had beaten Ashford three days earlier.

Entertaining first sees Ascot start well

In a thoroughly enjoyable first half, the home side showed every bit their intent with an energetic, quick-passing display that would leave the neutral uncertain as to who were the higher-ranked side. Harvey Harry was first to threaten, and came within a whisker of giving the hosts a sixth minute lead when he drove forwards, beat a couple of defenders, and cracked a shot onto the inside of the left-hand post before Hungerford scrambled the loose ball clear. Simmo then fired over the crossbar first-time after Aiden Payne-James had laid the ball off following a decent move two minutes later, although Harry should have given his side a fifteenth minute lead only to fire straight at visiting 'keeper Ryan Clarke when one-on-one after initially robbing a defender before racing clear.

Crusaders have their moments too

However, the visitors were not without their chances, and it took two moments of brilliance from home 'keeper Mark Scott to keep his side in the hunt. The first – nineteen minutes in – came via a decent low save to tip Jose Marquez's effort away, but the latter was a quite brilliant save to tip Baboucarr Jarra's close-range header over the bar; stretching out a hand when travelling in the opposite direction to tip the defender's powerful effort over the bar three minutes before the break. The Yellamen then defended a flurry of ensuring corners to keep it scoreless at the break.

Mad second half sees visitors twice come from behind

In a breathless sixteen-minute spell after the restart, all five goals were scored, and first blood went to Ascot in the 55th of them. Payne-James picked out Holland on the right, and his low cross was smashed home first-time by Simmo. However, the hosts' lead lasted just three minutes when Scott spilt Anthony Dwyer's powerful free-kick, and Marquez reacted quickly to fire home the rebound. The madness continued in the 63rd minute amidst a trainwreck of officiating; Ascot were awarded a penalty when Simmo was adjudged to have been fouled by Clarke – although whether he – or Payne-James in the build-up – were fouled was highly questionable, and surely if it was a foul then a red card should have been brandished for denying a clear goalscoring opportunity. But Igozouln would hammer home the resultant spot-kick before another three minutes passed when visiting substitute Louie Paget smashed home from long-range to level matters once again, and at this point the game was there for either side to take at 2-2. As it was, the visitors took their chance and when Jordan Rose picked out Anthony Dwyer with a raking pass over the defence, Dwyer made no mistake with a brilliant finish across Scott and into the bottom right. Simmo almost levelled matters again with a low shot well held by Clarke, although Scott still needed to be alert at the other end to keep out Dwyer's low effort in the closing stages as Hungerford sought a fourth.

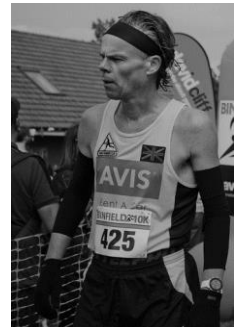

ASCOT BEAT WYCOMBE TO SURGE CLEAR

Beth's brace earns 2-1 win / Ascot United 2 - 1 Wycombe Wanderers Women, 12th January 2025



Ascot United Women opened up more daylight at the top of the Southern Region Women's Football League with victory over Wycombe Wanderers Women on Sunday afternoon. Beth Lloyd's double put Ascot in control, and although Wycombe scored a 95th minute consolation, it was a deserved victory for Andy Cox's side.

Title trail pits challengers together

This was the reverse fixture to that which both sides drew 2-2 earlier in the season, and with Wanderers eight points behind leaders Ascot and with a game in hand, a positive result for either side could prove to be pivotal in the title race. And, with second-placed Oxford City's game falling foul of the weather, the home side knew a win would put them nine points clear at the top.

Ascot edge tight first half

The home side were in decent form in the first half and almost led after fifteen minutes when Leah Littlechild did well to keep the ball in play on the right before cutting the ball back for Beth Lloyd, whose first time shot was saved by Amber Taylor. Kate Fox then tried her luck from distance barely a minute later and found the top of the crossbar, before Ascot took a 23rd minute lead in fine style. The time, Littlechild's raking pass picked out Liv Glover on the left, Glover cut the ball back for Lloyd, and she picked her spot with a sublime, looping lob into the right-hand corner. Charlie Torry fired over for Ascot just after the half hour mark, but the hosts could not add to their half time advantage.

Donnellan denies Wanderers who have chances of their own

The visitors were, however, not without chances of their own in the first half, and just before Lloyd's strike, home 'keeper Chloe Donnellan's brave interception – racing from her line to block at the feet of Kayla Potter – kept it goalless. Donnellan then repeated the trick just after Torry's effort for Ascot, this time racing out of her area to thwart Jess Watkins, before watching Potter fire the loose ball over her crossbar. Wycombe also produced a decent move of their own when Ellen Wordlaw showed great strength to plough through Georgia Luckhurst-McCord's tackle, picked out Emani Kassem, Kassem then released Watkins on the right to swing in a dangerous cross, which Danielle Puddefoot fired straight at Donnellan after the ball had broken to her just inside the area.

Second half takes 25 minutes to get going

The second half was initially a slow burner until Puddefoot fluffed her lines with a free header midway through the half when attempting to convert Bobby Lynch's free kick. At the other end, Lloyd skimmed the outside of an upright after Fox had won back possession and teed her up, but after starlet Alice Balaam had earlier come off the bench for Ascot – just as she had done one week earlier to good effect – there was a new threat on the right.

And, Balaam's delicious, raking pass in the 82nd minute found Glover on the opposition flank, Glover crossed for Lloyd, and Lloyd tricked her way through a challenge before punting the ball into the top right. The visitors threatened to set up a grandstand finale in the fifth minute of added time when Potter drilled home after a through ball had bounced off the back of the unfortunate Erin Huntley and dropped nicely for the shot, but Ascot saw out the remaining four minutes to move nine points clear of both Portchester and Oxford City.

Sean Fraser - defence/midfield. A hugely experienced player having played over 350 games for Slough Town. His presence within the squad will be invaluable throughout the season.



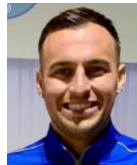

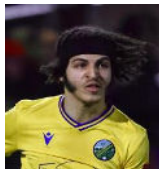

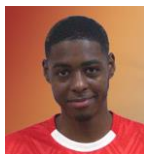

However, a league and FA Vase double in 22/23 eclipsed all that went before, before consolidating at Step 4 in 23/24. Jamie is also Senior Manager of Football Development at Brentford FC. **Sponsor:** Ascot United SYL U16's.



Dean Greenwood – assistant manager. Joined the coaching team in November 2022 and also has first team management experience from his spells in charge at Ashford Town (Middx) and Camberley Town. Also helped mastermind the league and FA Vase double. **Sponsor:** Ascot United SYL U16's.

Steve Quelch – coach. Many years of experience in the local game with Chalvey Sports and is a UEFA B coach, joined the club ahead of the 19/20 season. A big character, especially during our 22/23 double-winning campaign.



Alex Sykes – goalkeeper coach. Former England Futsal Goalkeeper who has been with Ascot United for several seasons. Dependable squad member who has also played in several first team matches when called upon due to injury or unavailability. **Sponsor:** Ascot United U14's.

Nathan Riley – physio. Joined us in 22/23 and became the club's main physio for 23/24. Another important member of our double-winning team. **Sponsor:** Shorefields Supplies



Ian Davies – Individual Player Development and S&C coach. Joins the coaching staff for 24/25 after a prolific career as a striker, primarily with Binfield, before netting 37 in 79 appearances for Ascot between 2019-2022. A qualified fitness instructor, Ian will also focus on the squad's rehabilitation between games.



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CLUB HISTORY - ASCOT UNITED

Ascot United as we know it, was founded in 1965 by a men's team who played their games at Sunninghill with "after match meetings" in The Wells in Cheapside village (now Mikado's). Teams played as long ago as 1928 under the name "Ascot United" but nothing to link them directly to the current club. In 1965, the club had gained permission from the Ascot Racecourse Trustees to convert the land east of coach park 10 into a football pitch. A wooden clubhouse was built, and this team went on to win many prestigious trophies in the years that followed.

Various youth teams represented Ascot United over the years up to 1988, and in 1992 the East Berks 7-a-side Association was formed by our then Chairman Keith Wicks, introducing small-sided junior games and having disbanded in 1980 the men's team also reformed. The men's senior team enjoyed early success through the East Berks League gaining continued promotions to the Senior division and winning various Cups including the Fielden Charity Cup in 1996/7. In 2001, the First Team join the Reading Senior League, were awarded FA Charter Standard status in 2004, and won the Reading Evening Post Senior Cup at the Madejski Stadium in 2006. Promotion to the Hellenic League Division 1 soon followed in 2007, before promotion to the Premier Division in 2009.

"The Yellamen" made their debut in the FA Cup in 2011 with a home tie against Wembley FC. The game attracted 1,149 people to The Racecourse on a Friday evening where the famous trophy itself was on display, and the match was streamed live on Facebook. In 2012-13 and 2015-16 we reached the Quarter Final of the FA Vase twice, enjoyed two top-three finishes in the UHlsport Hellenic League Premier Division, and won both the Bluefin Sport Challenge Cup and Perpetua Press Floodlit Cup. In 2018-19, new manager Jamie Tompkins led his side to the top of the table for long spells, and although they couldn't hang on to their lead, they would taste league cup glory once again by defeating Windsor FC 3-1.

A lateral move to the Combined Counties Premier Division for the 2019-20 season, combined with the installation of a new 3G pitch provided a platform for further development both on and off the pitch. The Yellamen were clear at the top of the league before COVID curtailed their first crack at the title before the 2021-22 season saw them reach the Bucks Senior Cup Final after defeating three sides from higher divisions, including Wycombe Wanderers in the semi-final in front of a club-record crowd of 1,267.

However, it is the 2022-23 campaign that will surely remain the club's most successful for decades to come. Tompkins' side dominated the league, taking 102 points from 38 league matches to win the title with four matches to spare. And if that wasn't enough, they achieved an incredible double by lifting the Isuzu FA Vase at Wembley in front of over 4,400 travelling Ascot United supporters and the BT Sport cameras. Impressively, they entered in the very first qualifying round before winning ten matches in a mesmerizing run; Kai Walters heading home in the 79th minute to secure a 1-0 win over the then-holders Newport Pagnell Town. After securing promotion to Step 4 for 2023-24, which was ultimately a season of consolidation in finishing mid-table, the 2024-25 campaign provides an opportunity to improve once again.

The club has also enjoyed much success at all levels particularly in the Women's and Girls Section. Our Senior Women won promotion to the Premier Division of the Southern Region Women's Football League in 2017-18 and were runners-up in both 2022-23 and 2023-24. Our Women's Phoenix side achieved back-to-back promotions from the Thames Valley League to take their place just one level below the Senior side for 2023-24, and the Junior Premier League (U18s) also won their league title at the first attempt in 2022-23 and were runners-up in the league cup in 203-24.

Ascot United has grown to become one of the largest Community football clubs in the UK with over 1,000 registered players and over 90 teams playing every weekend embracing all ages and abilities from 5 year olds through to veterans. We are also extremely proud to have a mixed-ability team representing our club, the Ascot United Warriors, who are affiliated with Special Olympics GB.



CLUB HISTORY - HANWORTH VILLA

Hanworth Villa, 'The Villains,' was formed in 1976. In the early years, the team struggled in Division one of the Hounslow & District League, scoring a goal was usually celebrated with a public holiday. During a close season, following hard work by Jimmy Connors, the team was completely rebuilt and this led to them finishing as Division 1 Champions.

The following Season saw the club start an incredible run in the league, which finished 68 matches later, with the 'Villains' winning the Hounslow Premier League and the West Middlesex Divisions one and two championships. The success continued with Hanworth being elected to the newly formed Middlesex County Football League in 1984/1985.

From 1980 the club had a nomadic existence but in 1997 moved to their current headquarters at Rectory Meadow. This move led to the formation of Hanworth Villa Sunday and a new reserve team, being an amalgamation of teams from The Sawyers Arms, The Queen Dowager and Feltham Railway Club. A Chiswick League double in 1992/1993 and a 19-0 Cup Final victory in the National Railways Cup cemented the successful amalgamation.

Following hard work by Dave Brown the club was granted a lease at Rectory Meadow. At last the team had a permanent home and could set about converting an existing pavilion into a clubhouse, which has become known as the 'Ranch'. With a permanent base, Villa were also able to concentrate on improving the level of football, and in 2002/2003 a notable performance by the Saturday first team was to win 'the treble' of the Middlesex County Premier Cup, the Open Cup and the Middlesex County League. After another Premier League title in 2004/2005, with a record number of points, it was decided to move on and the club were elected to Division 1 of the Combined Counties League in 2005/2006.

It took a while to adapt to the new level of football, but in the second season they managed to win the Challenge Cup. The following season, 2007/2008, the team managed to successfully defend the Challenge Cup and also narrowly miss out on the league title, finishing a credible second. However the lack of facilities at the 'Ranch' prevented promotion to the Premier Division.

The club were determined to ensure that the situation should not arise again and with typical determination the committee managed to raise the funds to ensure that floodlights and a spectator stand were installed in time for the 2008/2009 campaign. The effort was not in vain as once again the team finished second and following a successful ground inspection Hanworth Villa were promoted to the Combined Counties Premier League for the 2009/2010 season

The debut season was as expected difficult with points being few and far between and it was not until the second half of the campaign that the team came to terms with the standard of football required. By the end of the season the team had collected enough points to finish 17th, three points clear of relegation. The first season taught the club a lot and changes were put in place to allow for a more comfortable second season, in which not only did the team finish in 5th position in the league, but also reached the finals of the Middlesex Senior Charity Cup and the Southern Combination Cup. Unfortunately they were to lose in both. The 2011/2012 season will live long in the memory of all concerned at the club as being their most successful in national competition. In the FA Cup the team, after victories over Shrivenham, Bedfont Sports, Wembley, Aveley and Slough, lined up against AFC Totten for a place in the 1st Round proper, a rare achievement for a team competing at national level 9. In a very close encounter AFC won 3-2.

CLUB HISTORY - HANWORTH VILLA

In the FA Vase the team reached the 3rd round losing to Herne Bay, one of the beaten semi-finalists that year.

In 2013/2014 the team were successful in achieving a double, in winning both the Middlesex Premier League Cup and the Southern Combination Cup.

At the end of the 2015/16 season the club appointed former Queens Park Rangers and Fulham defender Rufus Brevett as their new manager. Rufus had previously managed at Arlesey Town and had coached at Banbury United.

Under the Management of Rufus and his team, Bobby Watson, Carl Cleaver and Cliff Angol the team won the Middlesex Senior Charity Cup with a 3 – 2 win over Spelthorne Sports. It was the second occasion in three years that the team have won this trophy.

In December 2018, by mutual agreement, Rufus Brevett stepped down as first team Manager with Louis Carder-Walcott, previously Assistant Manager at Westfield FC, being appointed shortly after.

Following a poor run of form at the start of the 2019/20 and with no positive signs of recovery it was, by mutual agreement, decided that Louis would step down as Manager of the club. In November 2019 the position was filled by Simon Haughney and his management team of Paul Thomas and Leon Solomon. The players responded well to this new team and with the addition of several new signings performed well, despite the distractions of the Covid pandemic. Not only did they remain unbeaten in the ten matches played during the suspended 2020-21 season, they also set a new club record by progressing to the last 16 of the FA Vase, narrowly losing to Long Eaton United on penalties.

Last season proved to be the greatest in the history of Hanworth Villa FC and, in winning the inaugural Combined Counties North Premier Division and with it promotion to the Isthmian League, the club achieved their highest position in senior football since the formation in 1976. The most remarkable record of all is, however, that the team remained unbeaten throughout the league season.

Once again, following promotion, the team had to come to terms with competing at a higher level within the NLS. Having kept most of the Invincibles squad from the previous season Simon, Paul and Leon added some additional experience within the squad and although through early loss of form and key injuries the team slowly began to get to grips with football at step 4 within the NLS. As the season progressed so did the team and the results culminating with a 2-1 victory over Northwood in April 22 to clinch 4th in the IFL South Central Division and a semi final play off game away to Marlow. A tense tie was 1-1 going into the last minute of the game when George Wells stepped up and clinched the tie with a fine goal. Having won through to the final all that stood between Hanworth Villa and back to back promotions was Walton & Hersham one of Simon and Pauls previous clubs. In front of a 2,500 crowd at the EXCEL stadium in Walton Villa took a first half lead but could not hold onto it going down 3-1 to Walton & Hersham.

Hanworth Villa retained the services of Simon & Paul for the new 2023/24 season in the face of many approaches from many clubs for their services and look to build on the success of recent years. The 2023/24 season was also notable with Gary Brunning, so instrumental in driving the club to the dizzy heights of the NLS step 4, stepping down as chairman being replaced by James Connor, Ex-Millwall professional footballer, and son of the original founder Jimmy Connor who's vision and drive will take the club further up the NLS pyramid. Gary Brunning moves up to Joint President of Hanworth Villa sharing the position with Jimmy Connor. It should be noted that Gary Brunning not only drove the development of the club over the past 35 years but also gave unswerving service to the club as a player playing a big part of our achievements between 1978 and our eventual promotion to step 6 and the Combined Counties FL playing first team football well into his 40's. He was approached many times to play higher up the football pyramid by higher ranked teams but remained loyal to Hanworth Villa over all those years and for this the club will always be grateful.
