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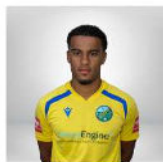

Leatherhead swept past Ascot United with ease on the way to a comfortable victory at Fetcham Grove on Saturday.

The Tanners took a 14th minute lead through Jacob Breckon's thumping effort straight down the middle, before Jordan Gallagher lifted home a second goal after the unmarked Breckon had chested the ball into his path from Mark Waters' cross. Hogan then tapped home number three in the 28th minute after Breckon's shot came back off a post, whereas Ascot were unable to threaten until 'keeper Rileigh Hebditch's full-stretch save denied Luis Le-Paih shortly before half time.

The home side eased back after the break but still added a fourth through Breckon's tap-in, with Ascot seeing Tyrese Osbourne drag wide and Hebditch saving from Lucias Vine in their own chances late-on.

The Yellamen drop to 17th, two places and two points above the bottom four.

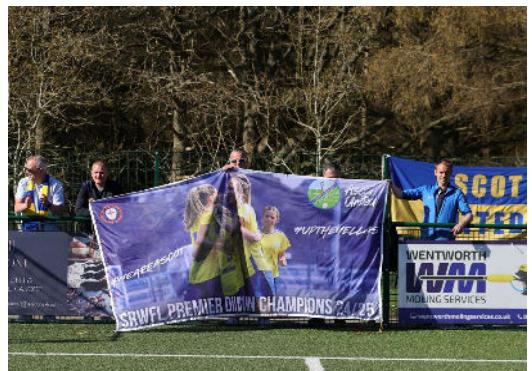

Solitary goal sinks Ascot

Ascot United Women slumped to a 1-0 defeat at home against Bournemouth Sports on Sunday. In an underwhelming display, Andy Cox's side rallied late-on and missed a golden chance to level it, but the effort was too little too late.

As for the first half, rarely will the fans watch a game almost totally devoid of chances. When it came, it almost resulted in a goal for the visitors, except for the frame of the goal.

Napping on their edge of their own final third, the home side gave too much time and space to Maisy Smith. She picked out Liane Folkernstern, Folkernstern teed up Rosie Eden on the left, and her cross-shot beat Cherry Preisner before cannoning back off the crossbar before being cleared.

Ascot's undoing came barely 20 seconds into the second half and it was all of their own doing. Preisner took one touch too many when attempting to clear, her effort was charged down, and in the aftermath it was Eden who slotted into an unguarded net.

The visitors rarely threatened again after that, and although Ascot were better, they were still unable to test 'keeper Jess Vallis.

Half-time substitute Anaïs Harney's volley produced an easy save in the 51st minute and Alice Balaam came within inches of stabbing home at the far post from Bella Cox's corner eight minutes later, but there was just something missing.

When Darcey Maxted's bullet header fizzed agonisingly wide from Jacey Lane's cross with seventeen minutes remaining, time was already running out, but they almost nicked something in added time.

Balaam's effort from another Cox corner was blocked in the first added minute of them, before Harney spurned a golden chance to level it in the fourth when she failed to get over the ball and her volley - unmarked - sailed over the top left following another delivery by Lane.

Smith's stunning interception from Balaam's meaningful-looking cross summed-up Sports's resolve, and it capped a disappointing few days in the yellow camp having gone into Tuesday's midweek game with a realistic chance of six points in five days, which ultimately only produced one.

Onto the next one, as they say.

Less than 20 minutes later and Horlock's side were 4-1 down to the League One Valiants, the lowest-ranked team in the first round's FA Cup adventure was coming to an end.

But it's those moments that make the FA Cup. For a few minutes, nine to be more precise, their travelling fans would have been wondering 'what if'. We all know about the financial rewards that comes with the FA Cup – the TV cash to boost the coffers, the benefit of prize money, extra sponsorship and ticket sales. Think of Havant & Waterlooville all those years ago when they led the mighty Liverpool not once but twice at Anfield. Think of Kidderminster Harriers taking West Ham to the final moments before Declan Rice bailed the Premier League side out. “It was a good three points,” he accidentally said live on Match of the Day the next day. “I’ve crumbled here!” Thankfully the striker doesn’t crumble when he’s in the box! “Where’s the matchball?” presenter Jason Mohammad asked. “It’s still in my car,” Linney responded with a smile. 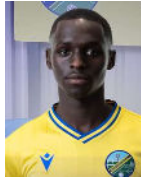

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CLUB HISTORY - ASCOT UNITED

Ascot United as we know it, was founded in 1965 by a men's team who played their games at Sunninghill with "after match meetings" in The Wells in Cheapside village (now Mikado's). Teams played as long ago as 1928 under the name "Ascot United" but nothing to link them directly to the current club. In 1965, the club had gained permission from the Ascot Racecourse Trustees to convert the land east of coach park 10 into a football pitch. A wooden clubhouse was built, and this team went on to win many prestigious trophies in the years that followed.

Various youth teams represented Ascot United over the years up to 1988, and in 1992 the East Berks 7-a-side Association was formed by our then Chairman Keith Wicks, introducing small-sided junior games and having disbanded in 1980 the men's team also reformed. The men's senior team enjoyed early success through the East Berks League gaining continued promotions to the Senior division and winning various Cups including the Fielden Charity Cup in 1996/7. In 2001, the First Team join the Reading Senior League, were awarded FA Charter Standard status in 2004, and won the Reading Evening Post Senior Cup at the Madejski Stadium in 2006. Promotion to the Hellenic League Division 1 soon followed in 2007, before promotion to the Premier Division in 2009.

"The Yellamen" made their debut in the FA Cup in 2011 with a home tie against Wembley FC. The game attracted 1,149 people to The Racecourse on a Friday evening where the famous trophy itself was on display, and the match was streamed live on Facebook. In 2012-13 and 2015-16 we reached the Quarter Final of the FA Vase twice, enjoyed two top-three finishes in the UHlsport Hellenic League Premier Division, and won both the Bluefin Sport Challenge Cup and Perpetua Press Floodlit Cup. In 2018-19, new manager Jamie Tompkins led his side to the top of the table for long spells, and although they couldn't hang on to their lead, they would taste league cup glory once again by defeating Windsor FC 3-1.

A lateral move to the Combined Counties Premier Division for the 2019-20 season, combined with the installation of a new 3G pitch provided a platform for further development both on and off the pitch. The Yellamen were clear at the top of the league before COVID curtailed their first crack at the title before the 2021-22 season saw them reach the Bucks Senior Cup Final after defeating three sides from higher divisions, including Wycombe Wanderers in the semi-final in front of a club-record crowd of 1,267.

However, it is the 2022-23 campaign that will surely remain the club's most successful for decades to come. Tompkins' side dominated the league, taking 102 points from 38 league matches to win the title with four matches to spare. And if that wasn't enough, they achieved an incredible double by lifting the Isuzu FA Vase at Wembley in front of over 4,400 travelling Ascot United supporters and the BT Sport cameras. Impressively, they entered in the very first qualifying round before winning ten matches in a mesmerizing run; Kai Walters heading home in the 79th minute to secure a 1-0 win over the then-holders Newport Pagnell Town. After securing promotion to Step 4 for 2023-24 where they consolidated their status by finishing mid-table, they pushed for promotion again in 2024-25 only to lose at Hanworth Villa in a play-off semi final. The 2025-26 campaign will see incoming manager Gavin Smith lead a new-looking squad following Tompkins' departure during the Summer; expectations remain high but with a touch of realism given the major change in personnel.

The club has also enjoyed much success at all levels particularly in the Women's and Girls Section. Our Senior Women won promotion to the Premier Division of the Southern Region Women's Football League in 2017-18 where they were runners-up in both 2022-23 and 2023-24. However, an unbeaten league campaign saw them crowned champions in 2024-25, earning them promotion to the National League at Step 4 for the 2025-26 campaign. Our Women's Phoenix side achieved back-to-back promotions from the Thames Valley League to take their place at Step 6 in 2023-24, and the Junior Premier League (U18s) also won their league title in 2022-23 and 2024-25.

Ascot United has grown to become one of the largest Community football clubs in the UK with over 1,000 registered players and over 90 teams playing every weekend embracing all ages and abilities from 5 year olds through to veterans. We are also extremely proud to have a mixed-ability team representing our club, the Ascot United Warriors, who are affiliated with Special Olympics GB.



CLUB HISTORY - MONEYFIELDS

The Club began its current guise back in 1987. Having reached the upper age group of the Portsmouth Junior Leagues, a group of players decided to continue playing as a collective by joining Portsmouth Civil Service and in turn forming their Reserve side.

Gradually most of the players moved up to the First Team, by 1991 the side had risen from the Portsmouth League into the Hampshire League Division One, coming off the back of three successive promotions. The Club's League success was also matched in Cup competitions with Portsmouth Senior Cup wins in 1991 and 1992, followed by Hampshire Intermediate Cup victories in 1992 and 1993.

After several seasons in the upper reaches of the Hampshire League, it became apparent that the Club would have to move away from their home in Copnor Road if they were to progress. After scouring the city, the Club agreed a lease on the old Moneyfields Sports Ground in Copnor.

In 1994 the Club moved to its current ground and became part of the Club whose name we now carry.

The Division One years were particularly successful and under the management of George Wain and Micky Gee, Moneys never finished lower than 6th and clinched the 1996-97 League Title by 15 points.

Success on the field was matched by extensive ground developments off it. This was in thanks to a National Lottery Sports Fund grant. New changing rooms, offices and a floodlit all-weather pitch were constructed as part of the scheme to bring the facilities up to Wessex League standard.

With the developments in place, the 1997-98 campaign saw a tense battle with Blackfield & Langley to see who would claim a spot in the Wessex league. Although Blackfield just pipped Moneys in the table, Moneyfields better facilities meant it was they who claimed promotion.

The first season in the Wessex League saw the club surprise many people by finishing 6th. The next couple of seasons saw the club post respectable top-ten finishes, but after finishing a disappointing 16th in 2000-01, George Wain and Micky Gee decided to step down after 13 seasons charge.

Under the managerial trio of Calvin Hore, Terry Arnold and Paul Gregory, and then the duo of Craig Stafford and Miles Rutherford, the Club has established itself in the middle third of the table as well as embarking on a series of runs in the FA Cup and FA Vase.

CLUB HISTORY - MONEYFIELDS

The management line up was boosted in 2004-05 by the arrival of Bobby De Ste Croix and Alan Smith from Havant and Waterlooville. Where the duo managed to lead Moneys to mid-table finish, for 2 seasons in a row and reached the Final of the Portsmouth Senior Cup in 2005-06 losing 4-3 to Gosport Borough at West Leigh Park. In the 2006-07 Moneys reached the 3rd Round of the FA Vase, losing to AFC Totton. The 2007-08 season saw the sudden departure mid-season of Craig Stafford, with the team ending the season in 7th position. Moneys were defeated in the League Cup Final, losing 1-0 against Wimborne Town. They also reached the 2nd Qualifying Round of the FA Cup, being knocked out by Team Bath at Dover Road.

2008-09 season Moneyfields had their best start to the season, leading the remaining 21 teams for a short period of time and seeing Moneys youth product Conor Bailey scoring Moneys 100th Goal of the season. The campaign ended positively with the First Team and Reserve Team both Finishing third in their respective League Tables. While the 2009-10 season was Moneys worst season at home, with only 5 wins at Dover Road leaving the club in twelfth place. The Reserves ending the season in 4th place.

After 5 seasons in the Moneyfields Hot-Seat, Bobby De Ste Croix Retired as Manager. He was replaced by former Manager Micky Gee's son Graeme, who was also a very loyal player over the years at Moneyfields.

2010-11 season Moneys finished a respectable 7th place in the Wessex Premier League. Warren Hunt topped the goalscoring charts with a Club Record of 35 goals in a season. The Reserves finished 4th in the Wessex Combination League and finished Runners-Up in the Portsmouth Senior Cup Final losing 1-0 to Horndean. Moneys ended the following season [2011-12] in 4th position, with former AFC Bournemouth Forward Steve Hutchings finishing top goalscorer, with 34 goals. The Reserves again finished 4th but this time in the newly formed Wyvern Combination League, another Portsmouth Senior Cup Final defeat was on the cards for the Reserves, as they were beaten 4-3 at Fratton Park by US Portsmouth. The Club bounced back in the 2012-13 campaign with a Portsmouth Senior Cup victory, but then were Runner-Ups once again in the 2014-15 Portsmouth Senior Cup.

The 2015-16 saw Moneyfields manager Miles Rutherford resign after 12 years in charge and was replaced with Dave Carter, who joined from fellow Wessex Premier Division side Horndean in October. Carter led Moneys to an 8th placed finish and Moneys also reached the 4th Round of the FA Vase. The Reserves ended the season 2nd in the Wyvern Combination League.

CLUB HISTORY - MONEYFIELDS

In Carter's first full season at Dover Road (2016-17) Moneyfields finished top of the table in Wessex League Premier Division. But only three days after the season ended, the FA took 3-points away for Moneys fielding an ineligible player giving the title to Portland United. Moneys still gained promotion to the Southern Football League Division One South-East.

Moneys ended their first season in the Southern Football League Division One South-East with a decent 10th placed finish. The Club also entered FA Trophy for the first in their history.

2018-19 Moneys won a place in the Play-Offs, after ending the season 4th in the League Table, on 71 points. Despite clinching a Play-Off place, it was made impossible for the Club to gain promotion due to technicalities. This was because of a League restructuring and there then being insufficient space in the Leagues above for all of the Play-Off winners to be promoted.

Moneyfields were placed in 18th when the 2019-20 season was abandoned and were also in the Portsmouth Senior Cup Quarter-Final and the Hampshire Senior Cup Semi-Final. Moneys played the remaining Portsmouth Senior Cup ties during the 2020-21 season and went onto win the Portsmouth Senior Cup against Baffins Milton Rovers at Fratton Park. In February 2021 Dave Carter stepped down to join AFC Portchester as Manager, so the two Louis' (Savage and Bell) took charge for our Portsmouth Senior Cup Semi-Final versus Fareham Town and for the Final.

The 2021-22 campaign was Moneys first season back in the Wessex League after voluntarily being relegated due to a loss over sponsorship and finance because of the COVID-19 Pandemic. The team was under new management in Glenn Turnbull, Fraser Quirke, and Paul Barton, who joined from US Portsmouth. Moneys finished 9th in the League and made the Final of the Portsmouth Senior Cup, losing to Gosport Borough 4-1. The following season, Moneys played their home games at The Draper Tools Community Stadium (Home of Havant & Waterlooville) due to the redevelopment of Dover Road into the John Jenkins Stadium. The Club attendances were at an all-time high in the 2022-23 season, with gates averaging 230 per game, including a Club record attendance of 1,012 against AFC Portchester in a thrilling 3-3 draw on 27 December 2022.

On 13 April 2024, we beat Laverstock & Ford 4-2 away from home to clinch the Wessex Premier Division title, being the first team from Portsmouth to do so.



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
