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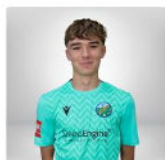

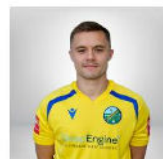

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MATCH REPORT ROUNDUP



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ASCOT AND BOGNOR DRAW 2-2 IN THRILLER

Rocks fight back from 2-0 to stun Yellas

**Saturday 31st January 2026 The Pitching In Isthmian League South Central Division, Ascot United 2 - 2
Bognor Regis Town**

Ascot United were pegged back by Bognor Regis Town in a thrilling encounter on Saturday. The home side were 2-0 up and could have been almost out of sight, only for the Sussex side to mount a stirring fightback and secure a deserved draw.

Rocks start and finish half well; Yellamen dominate middle

The visitors made a strong start to the game and only a good block followed by Mark Scott's fine save denied Preston Woolston after he had made a driving run and twice let rip in the ninth minute. But Ascot swarmed around their opponents like flies after that and could have been more than a few goals to the good at half time. Impressive loanee Francis Amartey raced through and elected to round visiting 'keeper Dan Lincoln in the thirteenth minute only to find the angle against him as Lincoln spread himself to make a save, before Babs Dehghani's goal-bound curler – teed up by Kai Allsopp nicked off a defender and wide for 26th minute corner. But from that corner – taken by Dehghani – defender Sean Fraser crashed the ball home first time into the bottom left with all the trimmings of a seasoned striker. It got better for Ascot five minutes later when Amartey made a nuisance of himself from Tyrese Osbourne's hanging cross, and Dehghani swept home on the volley to double his side's lead. Lincoln made a fine save to deny Amartey who went round him once again – stretching out a hand to tip the ball away when it looked like the striker had teed up a free shot at goal – before Osbourne stabbed home the rebound following Jaheim Kamara's cross. But just after Brandon Chebby had flashed a header narrowly wide for Bognor three minutes before the break, Ibra Busari intercepted Luis Le Paih's weak cross-field pass for Ascot to get his side moving forwards, Chebby's cross from the left looped up to the far post, and Jake Lawrence smashed home to make it more interesting at half time; 2-1 in favour of Ascot as the sides changed ends.

Visitors dominate second half littered with opportunities

In a breath-taking second half where both sides hit the woodwork, Bognor took the game to Ascot and ultimately forced a draw that their endeavours deserved. However, it was Lincoln in action first, sticking out an ankle to turn Osbourne's low effort to the near post behind for a corner after Le Paih had threaded him in. But after that it was almost one-way traffic at the other end; firstly Chebby's shot was saved by Scott and Woolstone fired over in the aftermath after Lennie Smith had played him in Lawrence then dragged across the goal and wide after Smith had raced behind Milo Stuart, before substitute Callum Laycock thundered home a header from Woolston's 75th minute corner; 2-2 and plenty of time left. Earlier, Kamara had cut inside and struck the outside of a post for Ascot, but that was a rare moment of respite before Lawrence's header sailed just wide from a corner and Woolston fired wide-right after another driving run. Lawrence then produced a moment of magic – a 360-spin and drag-back teed himself up for a shot that clattered the inside of the right hand post – but Ascot clung on. Lawrence then fired straight at Scott early-on in six minutes of added time after Ascot defender Jeremy Stewart had got his legs in a mess, although even then that, Ascot might have scored an improbable winner when Kamara's shot drifted just wide of the top left before Steve Gody set himself up for an effort that lacked the height or direction to trouble Lincoln despite being well-placed.

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ALFIE LUND'S incredible memorabilia collection and fundraising were proudly honoured at The NLP's National Game Awards ten years ago – now the Essex Senior League are aiming to help boost his scarf tally to 5,000!

Alfie's dad Mark picked up the Unsung Hero award at our NGAs back in 2016 in recognition of all the family were doing in raising awareness of a rare life-limiting condition. Apart from being an amazing story about a dad and lad's connection to the beautiful game, it was touching to see the impact they were having.

What started at the local park grew into father and son travelling to games throughout the steps to collect enough items to surround a football pitch if tied together. Mark arrived at Chelsea's Stamford Bridge – where we held the awards back in 2016 – with rolls of scarves he unfurled to decorate the room. It was quite the talking point among guests as they scoured the colourful display looking for clubs they knew.

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Shirts donated along the way were later sold, with the funds raised going to MECP2 Duplication Syndrome UK, supporting families with respite breaks, long hospital stays, sensory equipment and, sadly, funeral costs. Since then, Alfie's scarf haul has passed 3,438 and the ESL are hoping to help them reach a huge milestone with clubs already donating their own colours.

"There is now a new target in sight, we at Essex Senior League would like to help get Alfie to 5,000 scarves!" the ESL said. "If any level of the game can help make that happen, it's Non-League football. If any club, supporters or league can donate a scarf, old or new, you can help Alfie take another step towards that incredible milestone."

While Alfie isn't able to travel as far any more, the duo can often be seen out and about at Non-League grounds in the north west or at their Wigan Athletic. If you've got any scarves you'd like to donate and help boost the target, they'd be pleased to hear from you.

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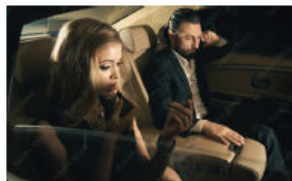

ROBINS EDGE OUT YELLOWWOMEN

Ascot slip to narrow defeat against Swindon

Ascot United Women were edged out 2-1 at The Racecourse by title favourites Swindon Town on Sunday. The visitors, with a near-perfect record this season, were largely dominant throughout and led 2-0 heading into stoppage time, only for Hattie Kettle's injury time header to give the hosts late hope.

Can The Yellowwomen pull off an upset?

The game was almost a free shot for Ascot. Having won their last three league games – crucially against those in-and-around them in the lower half of the table – they had fast-tracked themselves to mid-table security, but expectations of a fourth victory were tempered by The Robins' ominous record. That said, Swindon's perfect record had been ended one week early by Maidenhead United, the latter who Ascot had themselves beaten on the road earlier in the season. The question was would this have set the nerves jangling in the Wiltshire side's camp having slipped to defeat against The Magpies, leaving themselves in 2nd place, one point behind leaders Moneyfields but with only one game in hand? Seventh-placed Ascot had moved eleven points clear of the drop zone after their fine run, and they would need to be brave, physical and positive if they were to take anything from a highly-anticipated fixture against a side who only beat them 1-0 in the reverse match. Playing in a 1-3-5-2 formation, manager Andy Cox stuck with the same starting line-up that won last Sunday, but would need to make two changes before half-time.

Swindon dominate but only score one

Ascot were unfortunate to lose Dani Dias to a hamstring injury after just three minutes, and they would lose Ali Balaam in first half injury time after she went down holding her ankle following a strong challenge; Ella Rowntree was introduced for the latter and looked dangerous down to the left thereafter. In between that it was pretty much all Swindon, who pressed hard and forced a plethora of corners. But shortly after Billie Haynes' curling, left-footed cross-shot cannoned back of the crossbar, Taylor MacDonald stepped up to bend a fine free kick over the wall and into the left-hand corner in the 10th minute. Ascot rode their luck but thwarted a second as Libby Bedwell headed weakly at Cherry Preisner when she might have done better, Katie Sherwood saw her shot on the turn superbly tipped around a post by Preisner and Bedwell missed a sitter when she somehow headed wide from virtually under the bar. With only one goal separating the sides as they changed ends, there was more than a glimmer of hope for the hosts.

More even second half sees Swindon steal it

Ascot had more intent on the break but it was still the visitors who created most of the chances and shortly after Annie Colston had flashed a shot wide, she got just enough on a corner to beat Preisner, although there were extended objections that the ball had actually crossed the line in a six-yard-box melee. Colston then played in Haynes on the right, who drew a fine, sprawling save from Preisner in the 79th minute, before Preisner gleefully saved substitute Tori St. Clair's shot, which was straight at her in the 89th minute.

Lino bowled over by late drama

But Ascot were rewarded for their endeavours three minutes into stoppage time when Kettle came steaming onto a corner from the left and glanced a header into the bottom right for her third goal in three games, 1-2 and a couple of minutes to salvage an unlikely point. Just before that, the referee's assistant had tripped over backwards in the afternoon's comedy moment, before recovering to check his watch and the scoreboard, and refresh himself with where he actually was and what he was doing. Sianna Hagerty, an earlier substitution, had made a menace of herself since her introduction and both she and Poppy Dearlove threatened in the dying embers, but Swindon held on for their second single-goal win over Ascot of the season.

The Yellowwomen will travel to Abingdon United for a County Cup Semi Final next Sunday, and they will go there with no fear given their recent revival.

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CLUB HISTORY - ASCOT UNITED

Ascot United as we know it, was founded in 1965 by a men's team who played their games at Sunninghill with "after match meetings" in The Wells in Cheapside village (now Mikado's). Teams played as long ago as 1928 under the name "Ascot United" but nothing to link them directly to the current club. In 1965, the club had gained permission from the Ascot Racecourse Trustees to convert the land east of coach park 10 into a football pitch. A wooden clubhouse was built, and this team went on to win many prestigious trophies in the years that followed.

Various youth teams represented Ascot United over the years up to 1988, and in 1992 the East Berks 7-a-side Association was formed by our then Chairman Keith Wicks, introducing small-sided junior games and having disbanded in 1980 the men's team also reformed. The men's senior team enjoyed early success through the East Berks League gaining continued promotions to the Senior division and winning various Cups including the Fielden Charity Cup in 1996/7. In 2001, the First Team join the Reading Senior League, were awarded FA Charter Standard status in 2004, and won the Reading Evening Post Senior Cup at the Madejski Stadium in 2006. Promotion to the Hellenic League Division 1 soon followed in 2007, before promotion to the Premier Division in 2009.

"The Yellamen" made their debut in the FA Cup in 2011 with a home tie against Wembley FC. The game attracted 1,149 people to The Racecourse on a Friday evening where the famous trophy itself was on display, and the match was streamed live on Facebook. In 2012-13 and 2015-16 we reached the Quarter Final of the FA Vase twice, enjoyed two top-three finishes in the UHlsport Hellenic League Premier Division, and won both the Bluefin Sport Challenge Cup and Perpetua Press Floodlit Cup. In 2018-19, new manager Jamie Tompkins led his side to the top of the table for long spells, and although they couldn't hang on to their lead, they would taste league cup glory once again by defeating Windsor FC 3-1.

A lateral move to the Combined Counties Premier Division for the 2019-20 season, combined with the installation of a new 3G pitch provided a platform for further development both on and off the pitch. The Yellamen were clear at the top of the league before COVID curtailed their first crack at the title before the 2021-22 season saw them reach the Bucks Senior Cup Final after defeating three sides from higher divisions, including Wycombe Wanderers in the semi-final in front of a club-record crowd of 1,267.

However, it is the 2022-23 campaign that will surely remain the club's most successful for decades to come. Tompkins' side dominated the league, taking 102 points from 38 league matches to win the title with four matches to spare. And if that wasn't enough, they achieved an incredible double by lifting the Isuzu FA Vase at Wembley in front of over 4,400 travelling Ascot United supporters and the BT Sport cameras. Impressively, they entered in the very first qualifying round before winning ten matches in a mesmerizing run; Kai Walters heading home in the 79th minute to secure a 1-0 win over the then-holders Newport Pagnell Town. After securing promotion to Step 4 for 2023-24 where they consolidated their status by finishing mid-table, they pushed for promotion again in 2024-25 only to lose at Hanworth Villa in a play-off semi final. The 2025-26 campaign will see incoming manager Gavin Smith lead a new-looking squad following Tompkins' departure during the Summer; expectations remain high but with a touch of realism given the major change in personnel.

The club has also enjoyed much success at all levels particularly in the Women's and Girls Section. Our Senior Women won promotion to the Premier Division of the Southern Region Women's Football League in 2017-18 where they were runners-up in both 2022-23 and 2023-24. However, an unbeaten league campaign saw them crowned champions in 2024-25, earning them promotion to the National League at Step 4 for the 2025-26 campaign. Our Women's Phoenix side achieved back-to-back promotions from the Thames Valley League to take their place at Step 6 in 2023-24, and the Junior Premier League (U18s) also won their league title in 2022-23 and 2024-25.

Ascot United has grown to become one of the largest Community football clubs in the UK with over 1,000 registered players and over 90 teams playing every weekend embracing all ages and abilities from 5 year olds through to veterans. We are also extremely proud to have a mixed-ability team representing our club, the Ascot United Warriors, who are affiliated with Special Olympics GB.



CLUB HISTORY - AFC PORTCHESTER

In just over half a century AFC Portchester have grown from their humble beginnings as a Sunday League team to Step 4 of the non-league pyramid system and having a thriving ladies and youth section of 40 teams.

In April 1971, Lloyds Sports was formed and played in the City of Portsmouth Sunday League Division 6 under the guiding hand of Bob AR Sansbury. The club's name was changed to Colour vision Rangers in 1973.

The name was changed again three years later to Wicor Mill after Bob retired and Colin Brans took over as secretary. The club won various honours in the Saturday and Sunday local leagues and by the 1986-87 season Wicor Mill FC was the largest pub club in Hampshire, running seven teams in total.

The club had long harboured ambitions to climb up through the leagues to higher levels and ahead of the 1998-99 season Portchester were accepted into the Hampshire League and joined Division 3. They went on to win successive promotions to Hampshire Division 1, becoming champions in 2001-02.

A further name change followed in 2000 and the club was known as AFC Portchester for the first time. The season of 2002-03 brought the merger of AFC Portchester with youth football set up Castle Royals.

Portchester became members of the Wessex League in 2004 and they gained promotion to the Premier Division in 2012 after finishing runners-up in Division 1 under manager Glen Bridgeman. The club tried to climb up from Step 5 of the non league pyramid system for 13 years before they finally gained promotion in 2025.

Their best Premier Division finish before winning promotion was third place in 2014-15 under manager Graham Rix. Portchester missed out on automatic promotion under boss Dave Carter in 2022-23 with a heartbreaking final night of the season defeat which saw them slip from second to fourth place. They finished in the same position the following season only to lose at the semi finals stage of the Promotion Play-offs (continued next page).

However, an early sign of the silverware and success about to come arrived in the final of the Hampshire Senior Cup at the end of the 2023-24 campaign, where the Royals won the prestigious county trophy for the first time thanks to a penalty shoot-out victory over AFC Totton.

The season 2024-25 will forever be written in Portchester folklore. Gav Spurway's side not only won the Wessex Premier Division and promotion to Step 4 football, they also completed an unprecedented quadruple – adding the Wessex League Cup, Russell Cotes Cup and Portsmouth Senior Cup to their title win.

The Royals had the best points per game record of over 1,000 clubs in England, from the Premier League through the top ten levels of the game, and they lost only once during their league campaign.

AFC Portchester made their debut in the FA Vase in 2010, and first appeared in the FA Cup the following year. Their furthest run to date in the FA Cup has been to the Second Qualifying Round stage, which they have done four times. In the FA Vase the Royals have reached the Third Round stage on two occasions.

In 2011 AFC Portchester was proud to be awarded the Queens's Award for Voluntary Service – the MBE for groups and a measure of the club's important standing in the local community.

The OnSite Group Stadium is one of the finest non-league facilities on the south coast – the site has been transformed from a section of open playing field when the club moved there in the mid-2000s into a ground which now boasts multiple covered terracing and seated stands and four function suites.

The ladies section of the club has rapidly expanded in recent years and thanks to a number of recent promotions the first team has climbed to Tier 5 of the women's football pyramid in England.

The club's thriving youth section is one of the biggest in Hampshire and it gives boys and girls the chance to enjoy and play football from the ages groups of under-sevens up to under-18s.

The future looks bright for AFC Portchester as the club makes its Step 4 debut in the Isthmian League South Central Division in the 2025-26 season – and there are plenty of exciting future plans in the pipeline both on and off the pitch.
